## SEMESTER 3: Implement Assessment Plan & Strategy

Summary and analysis of data collected:

Prior to the Spring 2010 semester, I worked with Dr. Marcel (Music) to assemble the rubric necessary to evaluate music concert reports submitted for the Music Appreciation class requirements after the students attended Ars Electronica: The Ron Mazurek Memorial Concert, the annual concert dedicated to new multimedia compositions. The rubric was distributed to full-time and part-time music faculty teaching sections of Music Appreciation. Followup emails were sent by both Dr. Marcel and Prof. Krikun, requesting participation in the assessment project and recommending that faculty require students to attend the Ars Electronica event.
