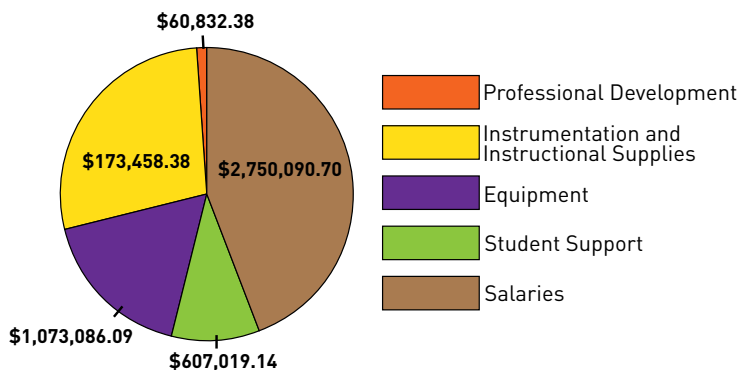

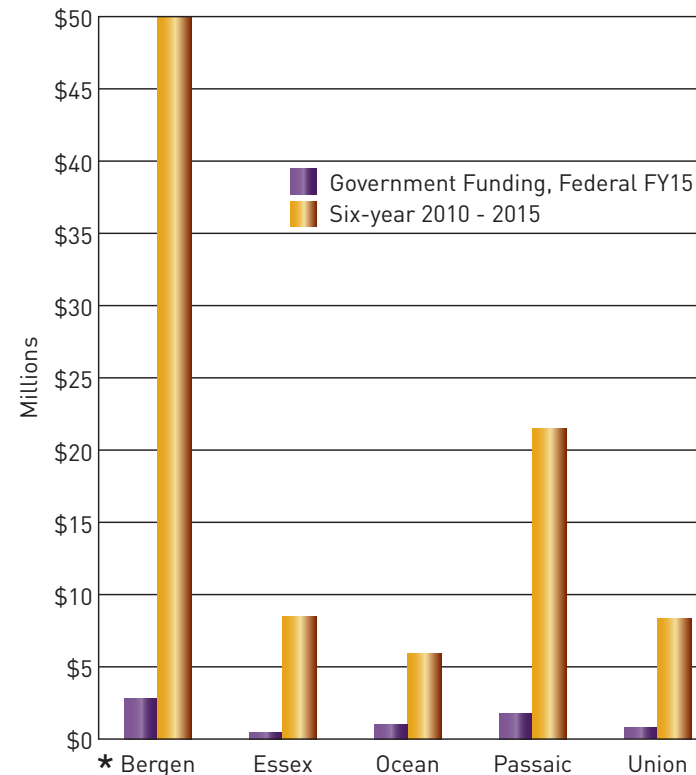


OFFICE OF GRANTS ADMINISTRATION

Helps close welfare cases by assisting participants in improving their education levels and/or attaining a High School Equivalency Diploma

College Readiness Now

\$42,877

Strengthens academic skills of high school seniors to get them college ready

Bridge to the Baccalaureate Alliance (B2B)

\$86,686

Assists more than 900 underrepresented minority students in successfully transferring into a baccalaureate STEM degree program

New Jersey Professions Pathways to Regional Excellence Trade Adjustment Assistance Community College and Career Training (TAACCCT)

\$3,885,332

Engages the partner community colleges in regional capacity-building that will encourage the sharing of programs, expertise, and approaches needed to create an efficient model for providing New Jersey employers with a highly skilled healthcare workforce. Bergen received \$935,220; consortium partners received \$2,950,112.

Hazard Mitigation - FEMA Generator Project

\$250,000

Takes the existing emergency power capability of the physical education facilities and upgrade and expand them so that the Bergen Community College emergency shelter.

OVW

\$300,000

Develops a prevention and intervention program to meet the needs of students as they relate to sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking.

Fulbright Scholar-In-Residence

\$19,500

Brings a scholar from France to our institutions with the goal of enhancing the global and historical focus of our theatre education and performance programs.

In the past five years, grants contributed more than \$44.1 million to Bergen Community College.
