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Bergen Community College was founded in 1965 to satisfy the region's need for a convenient, affordable and comprehensive higher education destination. The College currently enrolls over 15,000 students in credit courses, as well as over 8,000 more in continuing and adult education programs. The College's three instructional sites in Paramus (main campus), Hackensack (Ciarco Learning Center) and Lyndhurst (Bergen Community College at the Meadowlands) offer exceptional opportunities for students enrolled in degree, continuing education and adult education programs.

The College boasts an accomplished faculty, cutting-edge facilities and opportunities for cultural awareness, civic engagement and service-learning.

Graduating students not only utilize the statewide transfer agreement to attend New Jersey's fouryear schools, but use Bergen's reputation as a top community college to propel them to institutions nationwide. Students in career programs enter the workforce with the skills they need in order to succeed.

Within the last decade, Bergen has seen considerable growth in both size and facilities. Since 2005, credit enrollment has increased by 6% and the number of degrees and certificates awarded annually has more than doubled. Physical additions to the college include a Science Annex containing expanded and updated science laboratory facilities and a newly renovated complex in Lyndhurst, NJ that serves as the current home of BCC's new Paramedic Science Program. Most recently, the college began construction on a new Health Professions Integrated Teaching Center on its main campus in Paramus.

In 2016, Bergen Community College will go through its ten year self-study review by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education (MSCHE) to reaffirm its accreditation.



Student Characteristics Highlights

 Tenth-day student enrollment at Bergen Community College decreased from 15,882 in Fall 2013 to 15,651 in Fall 2014 (-1.5%). This marks the third year in a row that enrollment has decreased at Bergen Community College.

- Continuing a ten-year trend, the number of full-time students exceeded the number of part-time students in the Fall 2014 semester by a ratio of 57% full-time to 43% part-time, which is slightly up from Fall 2013's 56% full-time to 44% part-time split.
- Students from 138 different countries of citizenship attended BCC in Fall 2014, with the largest groups of non-US students hailing from the Republic of Korea, Colombia, the Dominican Republic, Poland, and Peru.
- Nearly 12,000 BCC students in Fall 2014 resided in Bergen County; 76% of the student population.
 Within Bergen County, the most BCC students resided in Hackensack, Garfield, Teaneck, Fair Lawn and Lodi.





Enrollment by Age, Fall 2014













• The proportion of degree/certificate-seeking students in Fall 2014 rose to 92.8% of the student population. The percentage of degree/certificate-seeking students out of the total student population has risen every year since Fall 2010.

- The percentage of students enrolled in transfer programs also increased slightly, from 75.4% of the student population in Fall 2013 to 76.9% of the student population in Fall 2014.
- The percentage of first time students increased by 1.5% from 21.7% of the total student population in Fall 2013 to 23.2% of the total student population in Fall 2014.
- The Associate of Science degree in General Professional Studies (AS.PS.GEN) continued a long-standing trend of being the most popular program offered at BCC. Its 3,331 declared majors made up more than 21% of the total enrollment for Fall 2014. This one transfer program held more declared majors (3,331) than all career programs combined (2,503) in Fall 2014.



- In the Fall 2014 semester, students were enrolled in a total of 167,024 credits, a slight increase from the previous year's total of 166,825 credits.



Credits by Course Type, Fall 2014









Distance Learning Percentage of Total Credits*, Fall 2010 - Fall 2014



Non-Credit Enrollment Highlights

- Non-credit courses are offered in three areas: Continuing Education, Ciarco Learning Center and the Institute for Learning in Retirement. The two main categories of non-credit courses are Open Enrollment and Customized Training. Customized Training is only available through the Continuing Education program.
- The total unduplicated headcount for Open Enrollment courses in all non-credit areas for Fiscal Year 2014 (FY2014) was 6,659 students, which is down from FY2013's unduplicated headcount of 7,223 students, an 8% reduction in enrollment.
- 4,669 students were enrolled in the Continuing Education area in FY2014. This number is identical to FY2013's enrollment of 4,669. While Open Enrollment in Continuing Education is down from 3,579 students in FY2013 to 3,080 students in FY2014 (a 14% decrease), unduplicated enrollment in Customized Training is up considerably from 1,090 in FY2013 to 1,589 in FY2014 (a 46% increase).



Degrees and Certificates Awarded Highlights

- The 2,610 degrees and certificates awarded to the students during academic year 2014 (AY2014) is a 14% increase from the AY2013 (2,285 degrees and certificates awarded). Over the past ten years, the number of degrees and certificates awarded has increased every year.
- There were three commencement dates at which degrees and certificates were awarded for the AY2014; August 2013, December 2013, and May 2014. Of the 2,610 degrees and certificates awarded in AY2014, 1,121 were given out in May 2014 (43%).

- The number of Associate of Arts (A.A.) Degrees awarded increased for the first time in three years, going from 329 degrees awarded in AY2013 to 392 degrees awarded in AY2014, a 19% increase.
- The number of degrees and certificates awarded in Career Programs (Associate of Applied Science Degree, Certificate, and Certificate of Achievement) increased by 12% from AY2013 to AY2014.





Full-Time Teaching Faculty by Tenure Status, Fall 2014





Adjunct Faculty by Race/Ethnicity, Fall 2014





Full-Time Staff by Race/Ethnicity, Fall 2014





• Total budgeted revenue increased by 1.5% from Fiscal Year 2014 (FY2014) to Fiscal Year 2015 (FY2015). The only notable shift in revenue source was the increase in aid from Bergen County. In FY2014, Bergen County made up 11.4%% of total revenue, but made up 12.0%% of total revenue in FY2015.

- Funding from the State of New Jersey remained consistent from FY2014 to FY2015 while funding from Bergen County rose. Revenue from Tuition and Fees rose from \$80,530,980 in FY2014 to \$81,462,580 in FY2015.
- Total budgeted unrestricted expenditures increased by 2.1% from FY2014 to FY2015. Eighty-nine percent of the total budget expenditures were allocated to the areas of instruction (37.8%), academic support (5.5%), institutional support (38.7%), and student services (7.0%). The remaining 11% was allocated to plant operations (9.3%) and other miscellaneous expenditures (1.7%).
- Expenditures on scholarships and fellowships remained consistent from FY2014 to FY2015 while expenditures on instruction, student services, and institutional support rose. The biggest rise in expenditures was on institutional support which went from \$43,701,373 in FY2014 to \$45,031,445 in FY2015, an increase of over one-million dollars.




