Highlights

- The Stop-Out survey was administered to students who had enrolled at BCC in Spring 2013 who had not re-enrolled in Fall 2013.
- The invitation to participate in the survey was texted to the students' cell phones and 344 students responded.
- Forty-five percent of respondents reported that they entered Bergen Community College for the purpose of obtaining an associate's degree while 34% of respondents indicated they had entered BCC to take courses necessary for transfer to another institution.
- When asked why they left BCC, 49 respondents indicated that they had applied for financial aid, but did not receive it.
- Forty-two percent of respondents said they plan to re-enroll at Bergen Community College at some point in the future.
- Thirty-six percent of respondents had transferred to another college/university. In-state
 colleges/universities were the most popular for Bergen transfer students with Rutgers University (17
 transfers), Montclair State University (10 transfers), and Fairleigh Dickinson University (9 transfers)
 topping the list of schools.
- Eighty-three percent of respondents indicated that they would recommend Bergen Community College to a friend or family member. The most popular reason for not recommending Bergen was that it reminded students too much of high school.
- Seventy percent of respondents who had not transferred to a college/university indicated at the time of the survey that they had no plans to transfer to another college/university.

Introduction

The Stop-Out Survey was administered to students who had enrolled at Bergen Community College in Spring 2013 who had not re-enrolled in Fall 2013. The intent of the survey was to learn the various reasons why these students failed to return to BCC. A ten-question, online survey was developed and an invitation to participate was texted to the students' cell phones in October 2013. The survey was open from October 11th, 2013 to November 1st, 2013 and had 344 total respondents. The tabulations of the responses are presented in this report.


Reasons for Entering Bergen Community College

When asked "For what purpose did you enter Bergen Community College?" 45% of respondents said they were at BCC to obtain an associate's degree. This was closely followed by students who wanted to take courses necessary for transferring to another college (34%).


Reasons for Leaving Bergen Community College

The students were asked "What made you choose to leave Bergen Community College?" and were given thirteen possible options to choose from and then an option to write in any additional reasons. The most popular response was "Decided to attend a different college" (93 responses). The second most popular was "Applied for financial aid, but did not receive it" (49 responses). Table 2 shows the results of this question.

What made you choose to leave Bergen Community College? Top Five Reasons



These other reasons ranged from financial difficulties to family/home commitments and issues with courses to problems with professors and other faculty. 


Re-enrolling at Bergen Community College

When the students were asked "Do you plan to re-enroll at Bergen at any point in the future?" 145 (42%) of them said they intended to return while 29% said they had no intention of re-enrolling. Ninety-nine respondents were undecided (29%). Table 4 shows the results of this question.




Transferring to another College/University

The students were asked if they had transferred to another college/university since leaving Bergen Community College. A little more than one-third of the respondents were enrolled at another college/university at the time of the survey's administration (36%). Table 5 shows the breakdown for this question.

The 123 students who had transferred to another college/university at the time of the survey were asked "What is the name of the college/university you are currently enrolled in?" In total, the respondents reported enrollment in 45 different institutions. Rutgers University had the highest number of transfer students at 17 with Montclair State University at second with 10 transfers. Among the transfer institutions were community colleges, New Jersey state universities, nursing schools, technical institutes, international universities, and for-profit schools. Table 6 shows the breakdown of the 45 transfer institutions and the number of students enrolled in each.



Planning to Transfer to another College/University

The 221 respondents who indicated that they had not transferred to a college/university since leaving BCC were asked "Are you planning to transfer to another college/university?" Out of the 214 respondents, 64 (30%) indicated that they were planning to transfer to another college/university. The results from this question are shown in Table 7.

The 64 respondents who said they were planning to transfer to another college/university were asked as a follow-up question, "What is the name of the college/university you are planning on transferring to?" The students named 21 different institutions for potential transfer. Seven students were interested in transferring to Montclair State University and another 7 were interested in transferring to William Paterson University. Fourteen students were deemed as Undecided because they either answered "Undecided" or put down two or more institutions to which they could potentially transfer. Thirteen students were marked as Unknown because they either left the comment field blank or answered "Unknown" or "N/A." Table 8 breaks down the 64 responses.



Recommending Bergen Community College

Students were asked whether they would recommend Bergen Community College to a friend. Two hundred seventy-three of the 327 respondents (83%) said they would recommend BCC. Table 9 shows the results of this question.




Recommending Bergen Community College (continued)

The 54 respondents who indicated they would not recommend Bergen Community College to a friend were asked to explain their choice. Out of the 54 respondents, 40 gave an explanation. Reasons ranged from the high price for attending BCC to problems with faculty/staff and professors. The most agreed upon issue with BCC amongst respondents was that the college reminded them too much of high school (7 respondents). The responses are grouped into 7 broad categories in Table 10 below.




Additional Comments

At the end of the survey, the students were asked to provide additional comments regarding their experience at Bergen Community College. In total, 151 students left comments, which were very different in nature and covered a wide range of topics. As Table 11 shows, of the 151 comments, 37 of them were positive remarks about BCC (24%) while 34 of them were negative in nature (23%). Forty-two of the commenters (28%) expressed their intentions to re-enroll in BCC either when a class they need becomes available or when they are able to do so financially.

Table 12: Comments related to Students' Financial Issues

- 1. Can't pay the tuition
- 2. I have been unemployed for 2 years now and money has gotten entirely too tight to fund this semester. I applied for financial aid and was not approved for any funds.
- 3. I would return to finish my studies but right now with money issues i could not afford to go back until i am able to afford it.
- 4. The Financial aid office always has a long, long, long line.

- 6. I can't enroll into school until i finish paying off what i owe

- 10. I left BC temporarily. During my enrollment, my son had a carpool to and from school. Unfortunately, he no longer is part of the carpool and I must drive him. Therefore, I am unable to attend class.
- 11. Planning on resuming classes for this Winter/Spring
- 12. Undecided if I will take any courses over the 2014 summer. It depends if I get an internship for the summer. That is my first priority.
- 13. Not planning on leaving the school until I graduate.
- 14. Had gotten sick during the year and had to take the year off

- 1. I'm very disappointed in regards to the way the process of paper work was handled for me to register for September 2013, I was told to pay for it and get a refund which was something I was not willing to do.

Everyone is there with their own agenda, rushing too and from class and there is no sense of community or friendliness. I guess I shouldn't have expected better since it is just a community college but overall the Bergen experience was subpar. I can see how an adult might be able to deal with Bergen but I would never recommend it to anyone right out of high school who wants an actual college experience.
- 3. Lenore Lerer, Needs to figure out how the world works.
