Transfer Articulation Agreement Between Fairleigh Dickinson University And Bergen County Community College

Fairleigh Dickinson University (FDU) and Bergen County Community College (BCCC) hereby agree, on this 1st day of January, 2014 to continue a program that enables BCCC students to complete the upper division courses required for certain FDU undergraduate degree programs and specific graduate programs (hereafter defined as the 'Program').

FOR AND IN consideration of the mutual covenants and Agreements herein contained and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto do hereby covenant and agree as follows:

1. Academic and Administrative Components:

Students completing the prescribed program will be awarded an undergraduate degree (Bachelor of Arts) from FDU.

- a. All students enrolled in the Program will be subject to FDU's academic policies as stated in the University's Student Handbook. The University reserves the right to change its policies and procedures as conditions warrant.
- b. FDU shall have complete authority over matters pertaining to admission to the Program, course waivers, or substitutions and all other related program administration.
- c. FDU will have complete authority over curriculum requirements including, but not limited to course offerings, course and graduation requirements, grading, and faculty selected to teach upper division courses.
- d. The tuition and fees for courses taught by FDU for the degree completion program at FDU will be established by FDU.
- e. FDU retains the right to set minimum enrollments in courses as a part of the degree completion program.
- f. FDU shall have the right to discontinue one or more programs if enrollments fall below certain levels. If this occurs students may be required to take one or more courses at FDU's main campus to complete the degree requirements.

2. Admissions:

- a. Admissions standards for students entering into the program from BCCC will be consistent with FDU policies.
- b. All matriculated students at BCCC must complete one of the A.A. or A.S. programs listed on Attachment A ("Associate Degree") prior to enrolling in the B.A. degree completion program.

- c. All credits taken at BCCC up to a maximum of sixty-six (64) that are part of an Associate Degree will be transferred to the B.A. program listed in Attachment B. Courses taken beyond those required for an Associate Degree will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis.
- d. Students not matriculated at BCCC but having sixty-four (64) or more credits may apply directly to the B.A. degree completion program.

3. Degrees:

The parties recognize that the Associate Degrees and Bachelor Degrees contemplated to be part of the program are listed on Attachments A & B. However, the parties acknowledge that in the event they agree to change the either of such lists, this Agreement shall be amended to reflect the new Attachment A and/or Attachment B, as applicable.

4. Financial:

The B.A. portion of the program shall be administered in accordance with the established fiscal, personnel systems and policies of FDU. FDU shall be responsible for all students billing and other fiscal and academic records.

Indemnification. BCCC agrees to indemnify and save FDU harmless from and against all liability, and all loss, cost and expense, including reasonable attorneys' fees, arising out of any breach of this Agreement by BCCC. However, notwithstanding anything herein contained to the contrary, BCCC shall not be obligated or required hereunder, to hold harmless or indemnify FDU from or against any liability, loss, cost, expense, or claim to the extent arising from any act, omission or negligence of FDU or its agents, servants, employees or contractors.

FDU agrees to indemnify and save BCCC harmless from and against all liability, and all loss, cost and expense, including reasonable attorneys' fees, arising out of any breach of this Agreement by FDU. However, notwithstanding anything herein contained to the contrary, FDU shall not be obligated or required hereunder, to hold harmless or indemnify BCCC from or against any liability, loss, cost, expense, or claim to the extent arising from any act, omission or negligence of BCCC or its agents, servants, employees or contractors.

The provisions of this section shall survive the expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement.

Both parties agree to obtain, at their own expense, Commercial General Liability insurance, in the sum of not less than \$1,000,000 for bodily injury or death to any one person and \$3,000,000 for bodily injury or death to any number of persons in any one occurrence, and \$500,000 for property damage. BCCC shall insure itself and FDU, as their interests may appear, against any and all claims for loss, damage, injury or death, and damage to, or loss of, personal or real property. BCCC's insurance policy shall provide that it shall not be cancelled or terminated without 30 days' written notice to FDU. BCCC's insurance policy shall be primary and non-contributing with any insurance carried by FDU and shall contain a severability of interests clause, with respect to liability, and shall protect BCCC and FDU, as if separate insurance policies had been issued to each. The aforesaid liability insurance coverage shall be issued in the name of BCCC naming FDU as an additional insured.

Both parties shall also carry: workers compensation insurance, in such amount as may be required by the laws of the State of New Jersey, and employers' liability insurance. Both parties shall inform its insurance carrier of its obligation under this Agreement and shall include these obligations in its insurance coverage.

The forgoing insurance requirements shall not diminish or qualify either party's obligation to indemnify the other as provided in this Agreement.

Within ten (10) days prior to the expiration of all required insurance, BCCC shall deliver to FDU certificates of insurance evidencing the renewal of such insurance, for the term of this Agreement, unless the parties agree in writing to another date.

5. Non Discrimination. The parties to this Agreement hereby agree that they shall not unlawfully discriminate on the basis of race, color, creed, national origin, ancestry, disability, marital status, gender, sexual orientation, handicap, age, pregnancy status or veteran status in connection with this Agreement and that each shall fully comply with all Federal and State statutes, and all rules and regulations promulgated thereunder, concerning discrimination in connection with their respective obligations pursuant to this Agreement.

6. Term

- a. The term of this Agreement shall commence on January 1, 2014 and shall continue through June 30, 2017.
- b. This Agreement shall be reviewed by both parties and the provisions of the various attachments shall be approved or revised on an as needed basis.
- c. This agreement may be terminated as follows:
 - 1. FDU may terminate this agreement if BCCC breaches any material term, or provision of this Agreement which breach is not cured within thirty (30) days after receipt of written notice from FDU (or, in the case of any breach which cannot reasonably be expected to be cured within thirty (30) days, if BCCC fails to commence such cure within ten (10) days and fails to prosecute such cure to completion with due diligence within ninety (90) days); or
 - 2. BCCC may terminate this Agreement if FDU breaches any material term, or provision of this Agreement which breach is not cured within

- thirty (30) days after receipt of written notice from BCCC (or, in the case of any breach which cannot reasonably be expected to be cured within ten (10) days and fails to prosecute such cure to completion with due diligence within ninety (90) days).
- 3. Either party may terminate this Agreement for any reason by delivering written notice to the other. Any such notice shall take effect the later of sixty (60) days after delivery of the notice or the end of the then current academic year, whichever comes later.
- d. If this Agreement is terminated as described above, FDU shall take reasonable steps to assure completion of any than ongoing classes that are part of the Program but shall not be required to offer or begin any new classes.

6. General Provisions:

- a. The parties intend this Agreement to be in full compliance with the State of New Jersey's Transfer Policy of September 2007, and the Comprehensive Statewide Transfer Agreement.
- b. Neither Party shall have the right to assign this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other Party.
- c. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the Parties with respect to the subject to matter hereof. No modification hereof shall be binding upon any of the Parties hereto unless made in writing and signed by the Parties.
- d. The Parties are not and shall not be considered as partners or joint ventures. The execution of this agreement does not, and shall not constitute a partnership nor a principal/agent relationship between the Parties hereto.
- e. Each Party represents to the other that the person signing this agreement has the full authority to do so.
- f. This Agreement shall be reviewed by both parties and the provisions of the various Attachments shall be approved or revised on an annual basis each July to cover the following academic year.
- g. FDU and BCCC shall resolve any and all disputes arising under the terms of this Agreement, except as may be prohibited by law, by means of a two-step process. At the first step, the Parties shall engage in mediation. If mediation is unsuccessful, then the Parties shall engage in final and binding arbitration. FDU and BCCC agree to utilize the mediation and arbitration services of the American Arbitration Association. Each Party shall bear its own costs for legal fees and other expenses.
- h. The Parties may execute this Agreement in two counterparts, each of which shall have full legal force and effect.
- i. This Agreement shall be interpreted and construed under the laws of the State of New Jersey, principles of conflicts of law notwithstanding.
- j. If any provision of this Agreement shall be held invalid by a court of law for any reason, the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect.
- k. This agreement may not be waived, changed, modified, abandoned, or terminated, in whole or in part, except by an instrument signed by FDU and BCCC.

7. Every notice required or permitted under this Agreement shall be given in writing, to the respective address set forth below, and shall be sent by United States Postal Service Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested or overnight courier, provided that such courier obtains and makes available to its customers evidence of delivery, to the respective address below. Notice shall be deemed to be given upon receipt, provided, however, that in the event a party shall refuse to accept delivery of the notice, the notice shall nevertheless be deemed to be given upon the date of refusal to accept delivery.
