

ADDENDUM:

TRANSFER ARTICULATION AGREEMENT signed 11/25/97

A.S. DEGREE IN BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

and the

B.S. DEGREE IN MANAGEMENT

The purpose of this addendum is to update and modify the above specified articulation agreement and corresponding Joint Admissions Agreement to reflect programmatic changes at both institutions.

The terms of this agreement are specified in Appendix A: Recommended Degree Pattern; Appendix B: Approved Humanities Courses; and Appendix C: Approved Social Science Courses.

This addendum is based upon the completion of an Associate degree, AS.PS.BUS.ADM.

This addendum is in full compliance with the State’s Full Faith and Credit Policy, and the Transfer Advisory Board’s Interpretive Statement of that policy

The terms of this addendum apply to students graduating as of August 2005. Programmatic changes by either institution will necessitate amendments and/or addenda as appropriate.
