IV. CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT:

Kaufman talked about people telling him that they do not hear about the work that the Senate does, what curricula are passed, what resolutions. He is going to ask department chairs, beginning with the Fall 2017 semester, to place a Senate update on each month's meeting agendas. Senators can then report back to their colleagues what is being accomplished in the Senate.

Kaufman mentioned that VP Mullaney, not being able to attend the previous Senate meeting, would speak briefly today about shared governance. He then talked briefly about Success 101, pointing out that a new implementation plan for the course, and its role in the college curriculum, was on today's agenda under Old Business.

V. COMMITTEE REPORTS

Good and Welfare: On behalf of the Chair, Gina Costa, Dr. Tobyn DeMarco reported that 43 donations/gifts were sent over the past two years. \$2,463.29 was spent. \$1,276.00 came from faculty donations and there is \$400 in the bank account. There were 22 deaths, 14 illnesses and 7 births. Donations are made only to full time faculty for immediate family (spouses, children, siblings, parents). Gina sends out a request for funds twice a year and any member of the committee would be happy to take donations at any time. Jim Zorn suggested that there be an electronic way to make donations. Tobyn is going to look into the possibility of using PayPal.

VI. OLD BUSINESS:

Success 101 Proposal: Motion was made to approve the proposal as presented, effective Spring 2018 semester. The proposal had been agreed to by the Developmental English and College/Developmental Math faculty. The proposal is attached to these minutes. There was a motion to eliminate EBS-021 from the courses required to take IST, but it was defeated 5-31-5. The proposal was approved 27-6-9.

IT issues: Stephen Valkenburg spoke about the committee he was asked to form at the December, 2016 Senate meeting. This committee's purpose was to discuss/review IT decisions that affect classrooms and teaching. He explained that he will be forming an "infrastructure and systems users group", which would include all high volume users, but not each department. Rather he would reach out to Deans and Directors. He agreed that there was a need for more communication across the campus. He was asked about the VDI computers which are being installed and agreed to report back on the committee he is forming at the September, 2017 Faculty Senate meeting.

Shared Governance: AVP Mullaney had been asked to report on Shared Governance which was a major topic at the April, 2017 Senate meeting which he could not attend. He spoke about his support of shared governance and distributed an article he had written for *Academic Leader Magazine* about this subject. He was asked about the events concerning the ALP department and the lowering of SAT cut scores and the seeming lack of shared governance. He explained that the SAT cut was a state decision and mandated.

Date changes: Mullaney also announced the changes in the dates for Faculty Conference. They are now Tuesday, October 31, 2017 and Tuesday, April 17, 2018.

Evacuation Plan: VP Corcoran was asked about an evacuation plan. This was in response to the concerns regarding leaving the Paramus campus on the day that all buildings on all campuses were evacuated (and incoming traffic). He noted that this was the first time that all campuses had to be evacuated and he has had meetings with Paramus and Bergen County officials to address evacuation as well as other issues that were encountered. There will be another phone line installed as the telephone lines were overloaded.
