REPORTS

VICE CHAIRMAN'S REMARKS

Vice Chairman Silverstein commended the work of the Finance Committee and staff for their work and diligence in resolution A/F4 Authorization to Award Public Bid P-2334 for solid waste collection, disposal and recycling services to Gaeta Recycling Co., Inc, for a two-year period from February 2, 2021 through February 2, 2023. The staff reviewed and worked through the process to ultimately save the college and students a significant amount of money.

SECRETARY'S REMARKS

Secretary Carroll recommended the approval of the Tuesday, January 12th, 2021 board meeting and executive session minutes and the consent agenda dated February 2, 2021.

Trustee Carroll participated at the virtual Association of the Community College Trustees (ACCT) Leadership Conference and the Governance and Bylaws Committee.

TREASURER'S REMARKS

Treasurer Barreto, Chairman, Education and Student Affairs Committee recommended approval of E/SA1 and E/SA2.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

As President Friedman moves into the second month of his presidency, his intention to "hit the ground listening" has materialized in myriad ways. In addition to inspirational conversations with faculty, staff, students, union leadership, and community groups and even a sit-down interview on our own "Studio Bergen" television program he continues to meet with and listen to our external partners.

Dr. Friedman met with Bergen County Vocational Technical School District Superintendent Dr. Howard Lerner. The district maintains the Applied Technology High School on the campus in Ender Hall. Dr. Friedman appreciated the opportunity to discuss their collaborative visions. They look forward to additional stackable or dual enrollment programs for Bergen County students. Dr. Friedman was informed from Vice President Fisher that the program proposal for BCC's Cyber Security program is moving forward and the pathway from the high school program to BCC's program will be clear and seamless.

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Dr. Friedman spoke at the incredibly moving International Holocaust Remembrance Day. This was sponsored by Bergen's Center for Peace Justice and Reconciliation and the Museum of Jewish Heritage. It featured the remarks of Holocaust survivor, Erwin Forley. The Holocaust remains part of our shared history as global citizens. It carries specific importance for Dr. Friedman. His grandparents fled their homes in Eastern Europe in response to deadly pogroms, anti-Semitism, and the destruction of Jewish life and culture across the European continent. Given recent violent events at the nation's capital on January 6th, now more than ever in recent history, testimony from a holocaust survivor is so vitally important. Understanding how and why the holocaust occurred is an educational opportunity that can inform broader understandings of mass violence globally and highlight the value of promoting human rights, ethics and civic engagement. Dr. Friedman was honored to provide remarks and he is very proud of the center, Professor Beverly Margolies and her team.

Dr. Friedman was pleased to report that Black History month at Bergen organized by Dr. Maureen Ellis-Davis, Professor of Sociology, will kick-off on Thursday, February 4th with an opening ceremony. "Unwrap Your Gift" by Jean Clervil, a motivational speaker, will inspire the audience to chase their dreams and share useful strategies to fuel and sustain those dreams. This will be followed by a talk on February 10th by Dr. Thomas Craemer, Associate Professor of Public Policy at the University of Connecticut. He will present and receive questions regarding Reparations for "Black Descendants of Slavery". On February 11th, Mary Louise Romney Schaab, Independent Consultant will speak about her book *An Afro-Caribbean in the Nazi Era* from Papiamentu to German the work about her father's experience as a black merchant sailor. The sailor, Lionel Romney, was one of relatively few black people who was imprisoned in the Nazi concentration camp system and even fewer who survived to tell his story. Dr. Friedman encouraged everyone to join these and other events that highlight stories and achievements by African Americans and recognize their central role in United States history.

Dr. Friedman reported on resolutions that the board will approve during the February meeting:

- The first resolution pertained to the authorization adopting the ten-year facilities master plan, a project led by the college and N.K. Architects. This master plan which outlines the institution's strategic facilities needs based on enrollment trends and changes in higher education took shape with the input of students, faculty, staff, and community members. The plan provides the institution with a vision for BCC facilities. It can be carried out in stages in the coming years.
- The second resolution, the Board will authorize the college to submit a four-million-dollar county college (CTE) program expansion grant. The application is for the construction of an addition to the technical education center. If awarded, the grant would support expanded career and technical education program enrollment in the areas of advanced manufacturing, welding, and cyber security.
- Lastly, on the Board's agenda is the ratification of the spring pandemic reopening plan reflecting the work of the reopening taskforce, chaired by Dr. Hlavenka, task force subcommittees, the executive team, College leadership, union leadership, and students.

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Among the changes in the spring plan from the fall will be the addition a new third step to our on-campus screening process to strengthen our contact tracing capabilities with students, faculty and staff scanning their Bergen issued ID cards at all entry points. Dr. Friedman reminded everyone, including those joining us from outside the college, that Bergen remains open for business albeit virtually. For those visiting campus, we have taken extraordinary steps to ensure their safety. We have logged more than 20,000 visits to campus since September and in every case the college followed its protocols and has had no community spread of COVID-19.

Dr. Friedman received several emails regarding concerns about the suspension of athletic activities, especially the baseball season. This is being discussed with the COVID-19 task force.

Next week Dr. Friedman and some of the trustees will attend this year's Association of Community College Trustees (ACCT) "National Legislative Summit." This event, which normally takes place in Washington, D.C., will feature a virtual line up of speakers including members of Congress, political analysts and higher education policy advisors. It provides an opportunity for community college leaders like ourselves to share our legislative priorities and connect with our federal government leaders. It remains vitally important that we as a Community College Leaders advocate on behalf of the most vulnerable members of our community.

Dr. Friedman congratulated Jenny Gamez a student Conduct Generalist in the Office of Student Life and Conduct who recently received a Raymond Goldstone Foundation scholarship to the 2021 Association for Student Conduct Administration conference. She will attend the conference without costs enabling her to participate in an important step in her ongoing professional development. Congratulations Jenny.

Dr. Friedman quoted Dr. Ralph Choonoo, the Interim Vice President of Student Affairs.

Dr. Choonoo stated, "Jonathan Siemaszkiewicz, a Marine Veteran that I counseled when he was a student at Bergen is now majoring in Psychology at Fairleigh Dickinson University. At my suggestion, to expand his library of readings included Viktor Frankl's *Man's Search for Meaning* and Carl Jung's *Modern Man in Search of a Soul*. He is an extremely bright and introspective student whose curiosity and love of learning bode well for his chosen career of becoming a counselor and psychotherapist." Interim Vice President Choonoo informed Dr. Friedman that former BCC student, Catalina Escobar an Air force veteran who graduated from our nursing program earned her BSN and just landed her first job working in the emergency room of a hospital in San Antonio, Texas. Dr. Friedman thanked Dr. Choonoo for sharing these success stories.

Trustees, community members this is students' success. This is why we come to work each day. This is the transformative impact of this comprehensive community college. With the combined efforts of the Finance Office, Financial Aid and Information Technology, 4,399 students have received over four million three hundred thousand dollars in CARES emergency relief grants to date. Dr. Friedman also reported that at this point our enrollments continue to lag significantly behind last spring and are down around 15% in total credits for the traditional spring term with the ten-day count being completed yesterday.

We are exceeding expectations for late start terms and he will continue to keep you posted. As we make up ground with these late start enrollments we will enroll continuously throughout February. Needless to say, as we move towards completing a draft budget for discussion with the Audit and Finance Committee this will need to be factored in.

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In your packet, you will see the resignation of Angie Goldszmidt. Angie was the Academic Advisor to the Phi Theta Kappa chapter. She was also a Bergen graduate and, as Alan Kaufman has informed Dr. Friedman, a stellar student in several of his honors classes. I only just met her and I found her to be extremely dedicated and accomplished. Angie will be greatly missed and we wish her well in her next endeavors.

The Bergen Community College Foundation was presented with a challenge grant opportunity in the middle of December to raise \$ 50,000 dollars by December 31st, 2020. Simply put, if we raised \$ 50,000 dollars, the donor's contribution would be made. We quickly approached potential donors with this challenge and the great news is that we successfully completed the challenge. This is the first time we asked our community for help in this manner and the response was very gratifying. Thank you to Ron Miller and the Foundation Board for their incredible work on behalf of our students.

A notable faculty accomplishment. In November, Dr. Leigh Jonaitis, Professor of English was elected to be secretary of the two-year college English (TYCA) for a three-year term. This is the two-year college English association. This is the premier association for community college English professors and it now has an accomplished faculty member from Bergen and in its leadership.

Dr. Mi Ahn, Professor of Psychology, reported that on January 29th we participated on a Korean radio show. We were interviewed by a well know Korean radio show host and our students did a fabulous job in promoting BCC, particularly the bilingual continuing education classes they are taking. Thanks to our students' efforts in promoting BCC and continuing education. We've had many inquiries and several new students are registering. Our students have also formed a committee consisting of 15 members including a current Korean Student Association (KSA) president, the KSA alumni association president and continuing education students. Thank you Dr. Ahn.

A special note, many of our professors and students in the institute for Retired Learning (ILR) have never taught or taken an on-line class before the pandemic. Most were apprehensive but also very excited about the possibility of staying connected to their ILR Community during this challenging time. The division of Continuing Education and workforce development worked with our IT division and transitioned more than 15 courses to a virtual environment within fourteen days. Highlights include Barry Schiff our art instructor. He had never taught online before and now he is teaching a watercolors class. John Divine instructor of History is teaching a series on the Civil War with 30 students in attendance and Fred Voss an expert in Family History had an audience of over 40 students and kept them engaged with topics of genealogy. These instructors, as they serve and educate our seniors, exemplify the ethic of care that you have heard me speak about over the last few weeks.

Additional notes: a note about our workforce partnership with CVS Health. The first cohort of Pharmacy Technician Apprentices from the College's twelve million dollars statewide NJ Health Works grant has completed their classroom training and eight BCC students have been hired as Pharmacy Technician Apprentices throughout Bergen County. They are beginning on the job learning this month in an earn and learn model. Approximately forty potential apprentices will be screened for the next cohort which begins in February. This innovative model is being carried out across multiple health care areas and the consortium of fourteen community colleges represents how Bergen is leading the way in getting students trained and into the workforce both within Bergen County and statewide; this is continuous improvement in action.

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On January 28th, Dr. Christine Gillespie, Executive Director of Continuing Education and Workforce Development represented Bergen as a panelist at a United States Department of Labor (USDOL) sponsored event entitled "Resilient Business Engagement Strategies for Apprenticeship Expansion." Thank you, Christine.

In Dr. Friedman's final note, he mentioned the passing of Lynn Gray, Jr., who died in December of COVID-19. Many of you may not have known or heard of him but he was a pioneer of alternative models for public school education. Dr. Friedman referenced a line from his obituary that really stood out when he read it. It read: "He cared about the kids who fell through the cracks." I hope that all of us keep that sentiment in our hearts as we do what we do for our communities. Thank you.

AUDIT AND FINANCE

Chairman Fletcher informed trustees that the Audit and Finance Committee met on January 21, 2021. The committee is prepared to recommend resolutions AF1 to AF6 to be approved by the board members.

EDUCATION AND STUDENT AFFAIRS

Chairman Barreto informed trustees that the Education and Student Affairs Committee met on January 19, 2021. The committee will recommend resolution E/SA1 and E/SA2 for approval by the trustees.

PERSONNEL

Chairwoman Moralez-Diaz informed the board members that the Personnel Committee had a virtual meeting on January 19, 2021 and will be recommending the moving of resolutions P1A, B, C and P2 to P16 that appear on the agenda.

SITE AND FACILITIES

Trustee Longo, Chair, of the Site and Facilities Committee informed the board members that The Site and Facilities Committee had a virtual meeting on January 20, 2021. The committee will be recommending resolution S/F1 for approval by the trustees.

STRATEGIC PLANNING AND ISSUES

Chairman Ranjan reported that Dr. Brock Fisher, Vice President, Academic Affairs organized a team for The Strategic Planning and Issues Committee. A meeting will take place on February 3, 2021 with Trustee Ranjan and Dr. Friedman to discuss the various strategies. Trustee Ranjan has been very impressed with the team and will discuss strategic planning and issues with the committee.

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ALUMNI TRUSTEE

Mr. Krasowski has been attending the Association of Community College Trustees (ACCT) and has registered to attend seminars regarding legislative agenda and priorities of community colleges nationwide. The Alumni Trustee recognized Ms. Angie Goldszmidt, who had a monumental impact on student life at Bergen Community College. Mr. Krasowski emphasized how valuable her guidance and support was for his own academic success and the success of other students. Several students from the PTK and Honors programs recognized Ms. Goldszmidt for her dedication to Bergen Community College and our PTK Chapter. They wished her well in her new endeavors.

Angie Goldszmidt thanked everyone for the wonderful opportunity and is very grateful for the support from the College and the Board. Angie hopes that Bergen Community College will continue to grow leaders and invest in the Honors program.

CHAIRWOMAN'S REPORT

Chairwoman Blakeslee and Secretary Carroll took a tour of the new One Stop Center. This is an amazing step for the college. It is a completely open space that will allow our students to get everything they require and assistance they need. An office has been dedicated to our four-year higher education partners. On January 14th, Chairwoman Blakeslee joined the STEM program to visit with students and listen to their

presentations about their projects. The projects were very impressive, timely and insightful. In addition to the wonderful students, our faculty has clearly committed and dedicated their time through the pandemic. They made this program work.

Chairwoman Blakeslee reviewed an article in the newspaper regarding Secretary Carroll who will continue his volunteerism and has joined the political ticket in Hackensack. We wish you the best of luck.

NEW BUSINESS/BOARD MEMBERS

Trustee Ranjan provided an update regarding federal legislative priorities and state legislative priorities through the Association of Community College Trustees (ACCT). At the National Legislative Summit federal priorities will be discussed. There may be some way to reduce the burden on the fees that are paid to ACCT. There is a subcommittee to review the process and move this initiative forward. The NJCCC has arranged a meeting of all the attendees across the state to participate next week. This is a new initiative which was put forth by the current chair so we could represent ourselves as a full New Jersey delegation as opposed to individual colleges. Trustee Ranjan will provide an update.

Trustee Flinn reported that New Jersey has adopted a "Bridge Program" for graduating students in the class of 2021 and 2022. The Bridge Program will allow these students to take a bridge year and during that bridge year they will register for courses at BCC. This is a great opportunity for students to experience BCC and hopefully these students might consider attending BCC for their education.

The PTK Chapter is very successful and is known internationally. Hopefully, the PTK Chapter will continue at Bergen Community College and help countless students.






