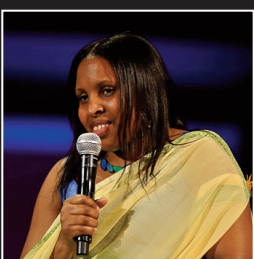

Eugenie Mukeshimana is a survivor of the 1994 Genocide Against Tutsis and the Founder and Executive Director of the Genocide Survivors Support Network (GSSN) a charitable organization with a mission to help genocide survivors rebuild their lives and use their voice to contribute to genocide prevention through education and advocacy. Since 2010, Eugenie has dedicated her career to serving survivors of genocide through GSSN.

Eugenie is a regular lecturer in special programs at the Museum of Jewish Heritage in New York. She is also a frequent panelist and speaker on issues of genocide and other human rights violations. She is a recipient of the 2012 Columbia University Human Rights Advocates Program Fellowship. She lives in Baltimore, MD.
