## About Bergen



Bergen Community College was founded in 1965 to satisfy the region's need for a convenient, affordable and comprehensive higher education destination. The College currently enrolls over 17,000 students in credit courses. The College's three instructional sites in Paramus (main campus), Hackensack (Ciarco Learning Center) and Lyndhurst (Bergen Community College at the Meadowlands) offer exceptional opportunities for students enrolled in degree, continuing education and adult education programs.

The College boasts an accomplished faculty, cutting-edge facilities, and opportunities for cultural awareness, civic engagement and service-learning.

Graduating students not only utilize the statewide transfer agreement to attend New Jersey's four-year schools, but use Bergen's reputation as a top community college to propel them to institutions nationwide. Students in career programs enter the workforce with the skills they need in order to succeed.

Within the last decade, Bergen has seen considerable growth in both size and facilities. The number of enrolled credit students has seen an increase of over 40%, and the number of degrees awarded by year since has nearly doubled since 2001. Among the most recent additions to the campus include the Technology Education Center, West Hall - home to Bergen's Educational Broadcast Center, Media Technologies, and arts and communications instructional facilities, a Science Annex containing expanded and updated science laboratory facilities, and most recently, the purchase and renovation of the complex in Lyndhurst, NJ that provides the current home for BCC at the Meadowlands.



# ***Student Characteristics***

## Student Characteristics Highlights


- ❏ Tenth-day student enrollment at Bergen Community College increased from 16,469 in Fall 2009 to 17,197 in Fall 2010, a new high for the College. This change represents an overall increase of 4.4% in enrollment.
- ❏ Continuing a recent trend, the number of full-time students exceeded the number of part-time students in the Fall 2010 semester. The percentage of full-time students increased in five years from 53% in Fall 2006 to 58% in Fall 2010.
- ❏ The racial/ethnic characteristics of the student body remained relatively consistent from Fall 2009 to Fall 2010. The percentage of students who identified as Hispanic/Latino increased to 32.4% of the total student population.
- ❏ Students from over 140 different countries of citizenship attended BCC in the Fall of 2010, with the largest groups of non-US students hailing from Korea, Poland, Colombia, India, and the Dominican Republic.
- ❏ Enrollment in distance learning courses (online and hybrid) continued to increase. Nearly 24% of students were enrolled in a distance education course in Fall 2010.
- ❏ Nearly 4% of credit students took their classes exclusively at the Lyndhurst location, while 7% of students took classes at both Paramus and the Meadowlands.




**Fall 2010 Enrollment by Age**









### Distance Learning Enrollment Percentage\*



# ***Program Data***

## Program Highlights

- ❖ The proportion of degree-seeking students in Fall 2010 remained consistent with the previous fall, at 90% of the student population.
- ❖ First-time, full-time, degree-seeking students represented 28% of all full-time students as well as 16% of the total student population in Fall 2010, a slight decrease from the previous year.
- ❖ The percentage of students enrolled in transfer programs also decreased slightly, to 71% in Fall 2010.
- ❖ Enrollment in Associate of Arts (A.A.) programs decreased by approximately 1%, and enrollment in Associate of Science (A.S.) programs increased by 6.7%, from Fall 2009 to Fall 2010.
- ❖ Enrollment in Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) programs increased by 8.5% from Fall 2009 to Fall 2010.
- ❖ Enrollment in Certificate (CERT) programs increased by 12%, while enrollment in Certificate of Achievement (COA) programs increased by 15%.
- ❖ Programs with the largest 5-year increases in number included General A.S. Professional Studies, Biology, Criminal Justice, Psychology, Hospitality Management, and Graphic Design.
- ❖ Programs with the largest decreases in number over the same span included General A.A. (Liberal Arts), Business Administration, Web Development, and Early Childhood Education.



## Credit Highlights


- ❏ In the Fall 2010 semester, students were enrolled in a total of 181,373 credits. Eighty percent (80%, 144,800 credits) of these credit enrollments were degree credits with the remaining 20% (36,573 credits) coming from remedial and American Language Program courses.
- ❏ In the Fall 2010 semester, students in degree programs were enrolled in 169,128 credits (degree and non-degree credits), a 5.7% increase from Fall 2009. Non-degree students were enrolled in a total of 12,245 credits, an increase of 4.1%.
- ❏ Of the total 181,373 enrolled credits in Fall 2010, 73.4% were generated by full-time students, a slight increase over the previous year.
- ❏ The percentage of total semester credits consisting of credits from distance education courses (online and hybrid) has increased slightly, from 8.7% in Fall 2009 to 9.9% in Fall 2010.
- ❏ The percentage of face-to-face credits taken at the Paramus campus in Fall 2010 was 88%; students taking credits at multiple locations represented 8% of face-to-face credits, and students taking credits at Lyndhurst only represented an additional 3.5%.







## **Non-credit Enrollment Highlights**

- ❏ Non-credit enrollments are offered in three areas: Continuing Education, Ciarco Learning Center and the Institute for Learning in Retirement. The two main categories of non-credit enrollment courses are Open Enrollment and Customized Training.
- ❏ The total unduplicated headcount of the Open Enrollment courses in all non-credit areas for FY 2010 was 9,807 students, an 18% increase from FY 2009.
- ❏ An additional 1,236 students were enrolled in Customized Training courses in the Continuing Education area during FY 2010.
- ❏ The total number of contact hours taken by non-credit students was 436,988 in FY 2010, a decrease of -12% from FY 2009.







Fiscal Year 2011




