Bergen Community College was founded in 1965 to satisfy the region's need for a convenient, affordable and comprehensive higher education destination. The College currently enrolls almost 15,000 students in credit courses. The College's three instructional sites in Paramus (main campus), Hackensack (Ciarco Learning Center) and Lyndhurst (Bergen Community College at the Meadowlands) offer exceptional opportunities for students enrolled in degree, continuing education and adult education programs.

The College boasts an accomplished faculty, cutting-edge facilities and opportunities for cultural awareness, civic engagement and service-learning. Bergen has the distinction of being New Jersey's No. 1 ranked institution for associate degree graduates, a title the College has held dating back to 2014.

Graduating students not only utilize the statewide transfer agreement to attend New Jersey's four-year institutions, but use Bergen's reputation as a top community college to propel them to institutions nationwide. Students in career programs enter the workforce with the skills they need in order to succeed.

Within the last decade, Bergen has seen considerable growth in both size and facilities. The biggest physical addition to the college has been the completion of a new Health Professions Integrated Teaching Center in Paramus, NJ featuring state-of-the-art dental hygiene equipment, a simulated operating room, and radiography and ultrasound labs. The 62,000 square foot center is the first of its kind in the region. Construction continues on an ambulance exterior concrete pad/training area and a new entrance sign on Paramus Road in Paramus, NJ.

In 2016, Bergen Community College went through its ten-year self-study review by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education (MSCHE) and reaffirmed its accreditation.

• Tenth-day student enrollment at Bergen Community College decreased from 14,585 students in Fall 2015 to 14,519 students in Fall 2016 (-0.5%). This marks the fifth year in a row that tenth-day enrollment has decreased at Bergen Community College.

- Despite an overall decrease in enrollment, the number of part-time students at Bergen Community College rose from 6,238 part-time students in Fall 2015 to 6,491 part-time students in Fall 2016. The ratio of full-time/part-time students also changed from a 57% full-time/43% part-time split in Fall 2015 to a 55% full-time/45% part-time split in Fall 2016.
- Students from over 140 different countries of citizenship attended BCC in Fall 2016, with the largest groups of non-US students hailing from the Republic of Korea, Colombia, the Dominican Republic, Ecuador and Peru.
- An overwhelming number of BCC students resided in Bergen County in Fall 2016. The five Bergen
 County municipalities with the most BCC students residing in them were Garfield, Hackensack,
 Teaneck, Lodi and Fair Lawn. Paramus, home to BCC's main campus, was ninth on the list with 365
 students also calling it home (3.1% of Fall 2016 enrollment).


 More than half of the Fall 2016 students were 18 – 21 years old in Fall 2016 (54.1%). This would suggest that although it is often assumed that community college students are non-traditional (i.e. delayed enrollment into postsecondary education) BCC seems to serve a large amount of traditional students (i.e. directly out of high school).




Unduplicated Enrollment by Age and Gender, Fall 2016





Unduplicated Enrollment by Status, Fall 2012 - Fall 2016



Percentage Enrolled by Course Time, Fall 2012 - Fall 2016







Enrollment by Campus, Fall 2016





- There were 11,406 students enrolled in transfer programs in Fall 2016 compared to just 2,077 students enrolled in career programs. Students in career programs have not outnumbered students in transfer programs since Fall 1986 (3,359 students in transfer programs compared to 3,427 in career programs).
- The percentage of first-time students increased from 22.1% of the total student population in Fall 2015 to 26.3% of the total student population in Fall 2016.
- The Associate of Science degree in General Professional Studies (AS.PS.GEN) continued a longstanding trend of being the most popular program offered at BCC. Its 3,490 declared majors accounted for almost a quarter of the student population in Fall 2016. This one transfer program held more declared majors than all career programs combined (2,077) in Fall 2016.



- In Fall 2016, students enrolled in a total of 152,948 credits. This is a 1.8% decrease from Fall 2015's total of 155,781 credits.
- Nearly 84% of Fall 2016 credits were college level course credits with the remaining 16% split amongst developmental education credits (11.4%) and American Language Program credits (4.8%).
- Full-time students were responsible for 71.1% of all credits in Fall 2016 while part-time students were responsible for the remaining 28.9%. When compared to Fall 2015, it is evident that the part-time student population at BCC is growing in comparison to the full-time student population as they jumped from being responsible for 27.6% of all credits to 28.9% in one year.



- The percentage of credits generated by online courses increased from 15,154 credits in Fall 2015 to 15,679 credits in Fall 2016. This was an increase of 3.4% despite the fact that the total number of credits enrolled decreased by 1.8%. Online course enrollment is growing despite decreasing enrollment trends showing that more students are opting for distance education.
- The percentage of credits taken at the Main Campus in Paramus decreased from 82.9% of all credits taken in Fall 2015 to 82.4% of all credits taken in Fall 2016 as BCC expanded offerings at other locations and expanded its distance education program.
- The number of hybrid course credits (courses that blend face-to-face learning with an online component) decreased for the first time since Fall 2012. It was only a slight decrease from 4.3% of all credits in Fall 2015 to 4.2% of all credits in Fall 2016, but it is interesting given the large uptick in strictly online education.
- Degree/Certificate Seeking students accounted for over 96% of all credits enrolled in Fall 2016 while Non-Degree students only accounted for 3.9% of all credits enrolled. The Non-Degree population at BCC has been slowly eroding away since the 1980s. With a total enrollment of 11,500 in Fall 1980, almost 5,000 students were considered Non-Degree. In Fall 2016, however, despite a total enrollment of 14,500, only 1,000 students were considered Non-Degree.



Credits by Student Status and Course Type, Fall 2016







Percentage of Total Number of Credits by Modality, Fall 2012 - Fall 2016





- Non-Credit courses are offered in three areas: Continuing Education, the Ciarco Learning Center, and the Institute for Learning in Retirement. The two main categories of non-credit courses are Open Enrollment and Customized Training. Customized Training is only available through the Continuing Education program.
- The total unduplicated headcount for Open Enrollment courses in all non-credit areas for Fiscal Year 2016 (FY2016) was 6,688 students. This is down from FY2015's unduplicated headcount of 6,958 students. This is a 3.9% decrease.
- Total duplicated enrollment in the Continuing Education Customized Training area increased from 1,144 enrollments in FY2015 to 1,528 enrollments in FY2016. This is a 33.6% increase.
- Unduplicated headcount in the Ciarco Learning Center Open Enrollment area decreased from 3,573 students in FY2015 to 3,342 students in FY2016, a 6.5% decrease.




Adjunct Faculty by Race/Ethnicity and Gender, Fall 2016

- Total budgeted revenue decreased by 5.0% from Fiscal Year (FY) 2016 (July 1st, 2015 June 30th, 2016) to Fiscal Year (FY) 2017 (July 1st, 2016 June 30th, 2017).
- Funding from the State of New Jersey as well as revenue from tuition and fees fell from FY2016 to FY2017 while funding from Bergen County rose from \$19,690,119 in FY2016 to \$20,109,880 in FY2017.

- Total budgeted unrestricted expenditures decreased by 5.3% from FY2016 to FY2017.
- In FY2017, 75.7% of the total budgeted unrestricted expenditures were allocated to the areas of instruction (37.6%) and institutional support (38.1%). The remaining 24.3% was allocated to the areas of academic support (6.3%), student services (7.4%), plant operations (9.3%) and other miscellaneous expenditures (1.2%).
- Expenditures on instruction decreased by almost \$3 million from FY2016 to FY2017 while expenditures on academic support increased by \$500,000.




