



General College Information





Bergen Community College was founded in 1963 to satisfy the region's need for a convenient, affordable and comprehensive higher education destination. The College currently enrolls over 11,000 students in credit courses. The College's three instructional sites in Paramus (main campus), Hackensack (Ciarco Learning Center) and Lyndhurst (Bergen Community College at the Meadowlands) offer exceptional opportunities for students enrolled in degree, continuing education and adult education programs.

The College boasts an accomplished faculty, cutting-edge facilities and opportunities for cultural awareness, civic engagement and service-learning. Bergen has the distinction of being New Jersey's No. 1 ranked institution for associate degree graduates, a title the College has held dating back to 2014.

Graduating students not only utilize the statewide transfer agreement to attend New Jersey's four-year institutions, but use Bergen's reputation as a top community college to propel them to institutions nationwide. Students in career programs enter the workforce with the skills they need in order to succeed.

Within the last decade, Bergen has seen considerable growth in both size and facilities. The biggest physical addition to the college has been the completion of a new Health Professions Integrated Teaching Center in Paramus, NJ featuring state-of-the-art dental hygiene equipment, a simulated operating room, and radiography and ultrasound labs. The 62,000 square foot center is the first of its kind in the region. More recent construction projects include the campus quad/outdoor classroom and the renovation of the One-stop Center at the main campus.

In 2016, Bergen Community College went through its ten-year self-study review by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education (MSCHE) and reaffirmed its accreditation.

In 2018, Bergen was one of 13 New Jersey community colleges to be awarded part of a \$20 million grant from the state of New Jersey to offer a tuition-free college education to qualifying students. This tuition free program began in Spring 2019 and it is now one of the State's financial aid opportunities for eligible community college students.



- Students from over 120 different countries of citizenship attended Bergen in Fall 2020, with the largest groups of non-U.S. students hailing from the Republic of Korea, the Dominican Republic, Colombia, Turkey, and Ecuador.
- More than three-quarters of Fall 2020 students resided in Bergen County. The top five Bergen County municipalities where students lived were Hackensack, Garfield, Teaneck, Fair Lawn, and Lodi.
 Paramus, home to the College's main campus, was 8th on the list with 276 students also calling it home. Lyndhurst, home of BCC at the Meadowlands, was 12th on the list with 238 students.





Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity and Gender, Fall 2020






Unduplicated Enrollment by Gender and Status, Fall 2020



Full-time Bergen students outnumbered Part-Time Bergen students in Fall 2020 – continuing a trend
established in Fall 2004. In Fall 2020, the difference was 53% Full-Timers to 47% Part-Timers.
However, the difference between the two groups has been getting smaller in recent years. This might
be an indication that Bergen is returning to a more even split between Full-Time students and PartTime students.

- The enrollment decreases from Fall 2019 to Fall 2020 hit Transfer Programs the hardest. Enrollment in Transfer Programs decreased from 9,950 to 8,519 a decrease of 17%. Although overall enrollment decreased, the percentage of students enrolled in Career and Non-Degree programs increased. Percentage of students enrolled in career programs increased from 14.2% percent to 15.2% in Fall 2020, and percentage of students enrolled in non-degree programs increased from 9.1% to 10.1% in Fall 2020.
- Bergen uses four registration classifications to rank students: First-Time students (new to higher education), Transfer students (new to Bergen, but not higher education), Stop-Out/Re-admit students (attended Bergen in the past, but did not attend Bergen the previous semester), and Continuing students (returning students from the previous semester to the current semester).
- These four classifications or registration statuses provide an interesting perspective of enrollment, especially about where enrollment has been decreasing. Bergen is not retaining students once they start as evidenced by a 22.0% decrease in the continuing student population between Fall 2016 (8,266 continuing students) and Fall 2020 (6,445 continuing students). Another worrisome trend is the decrease in first-time student enrollment, which fell from 3,817 students in Fall 2016 to 2,553 in Fall 2020 a -33.1% decrease.
- The most highly attended courses in Fall 2020 were in the Mathematics (MAT) discipline (4,223 enrollments and 14,469 credits generated overall). The most highly attended single course in Fall 2020 was English Composition I (WRT-101) (1,741 enrollments and 5,223 credits generated).





Unduplicated Enrollment by Attendance Status, Fall 2016 - Fall 2020







Percentage Enrolled by Program Type, Fall 2016 - Fall 2020







Enrollment by Registration Status, Fall 2016 - Fall 2020







Distance Education





- The COVID-19 pandemic drastically changed the delivery method of Bergen Community College courses. Though the percentage of the student body enrolled in at least one online course had generally increased gradually over the prior years, almost all students enrolled in at least one online course in Fall 2020. In Fall 2019, 25.3% of the student body was enrolled in at least one online course. In Fall 2020, that percentage was 97.0%.
- Nine-thousand, nine-hundred and twenty-seven students (9,927) were enrolled exclusively in Online courses in Fall 2020. This figure had risen every semester over the previous semesters despite overall declining enrollment, but shot up in Fall 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic introducing a primarily remote working and learning environment.

Number of Students Taking Bergen Courses Exclusively Online



- In Fall 2020, Bergen Community College codified the distinction between asynchronous, synchronous, and mix online classes. In online asynchronous courses, there is no regular meeting; in online synchronous courses, there are required virtual meeting days and times; and in online mix courses, there are a mix of asynchronous and synchronous class elements. The vast majority of students (83.3%) enrolled in at least some online asynchronous classes in Fall 2020, and a slim majority (52.7%) enrolled in at least some online synchronous classes as well. Most students (87.0%) took no inperson, face-to-face, or hybrid classes at all.
- In Fall 2016, 85.6% of all credits generated were from Face-to-Face classes with 10.3% generated from Online classes and only 4.2% generated by Hybrid classes. In Fall 2020, credits generated by Face-to-Face classes decreased precipitously to 0.6% of all credits, credits generated by Online classes increased dramatically to 93.3%, and credits generated by Hybrid classes increased to 5.6%.
- The most popular Online course disciplines in Fall 2020 were Mathematics, Writing, and Biology.
 Mathematics offered 168 courses online in Fall 2020, enrolling 4,222 students (duplicated) and accounting for 14,466 credits.
- The most popular Hybrid course disciplines in Fall 2020 were Nursing, Biology, Veterinary Technology, Dental Hygiene, and Diagnostic Medical Sonography. Nursing offered 17 Hybrid courses, enrolling 535 students (duplicated) and accounting for 2,134 credits.



Unduplicated Enrollment by Online Course Type, Fall 2020







REMEDIAL EDUCATION HIGHLIGHTS




- The number of students enrolled in at least one remedial course (EBS, ALP, or remedial MAT) has generally decreased over the past five Fall semesters. The largest decrease occurred between Fall 2019 and Fall 2020, the first regular semester since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic. In Fall 2019, 3,218 students were enrolled in at least one remedial course. By Fall 2020, that number was down to 2,386 students a 25.8% decrease.
- Remedial enrollment has consistently been highest in MAT courses relative to EBS and ALP courses. This enrollment trend continued in Fall 2020; 1,656 students were enrolled in at least one remedial MAT course, compared to 908 in at least one remedial EBS course and 338 in at least one ALP course.
- Among the five groups of remedial course-takers in Fall 2020, the largest group took only remedial MAT courses (1,141 students) without taking EBS or ALP courses. Students who were enrolled in MAT and EBS (510 students) made up the second largest group.
- The single most popular remedial course in Fall 2018 was MAT-011 (Basic Mathematics) with 581 course enrollments, followed by MAT-040 (Algebra for Liberal Arts) with 532 course enrollments.




Unduplicated Enrollment Within Remedial Courses, Fall 2020



Program Enrollment





- Bergen Community College's degrees and certificates are broken down into two categories Transfer Programs and Career Programs. Transfer Programs, designed to give students an education that is easily transferrable to a four-year college, include the Associate of Arts (A.A.) degrees, Associate of Science (A.S.) degrees, and the Associate of Fine Arts (A.F.A.) degrees. Career Programs, designed to give students the skills to immediately join the workforce, are divided into Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) degrees, Certificates (CERT.), and Certificates of Achievement (C.O.A.).
- Associate of Science degrees continued to be the most popular offerings at Bergen Community
 College in Fall 2020. Over 6,700 students were enrolled in A.S. degrees almost two-thirds of the
 entire student body. Although, enrollment has decreased in the last five years, Non-Degree
 enrollment has mostly moved at an incremental level in the last five years, with percentage of
 enrollment increasing from 7.1% in 2016 to 10.1% in 2020
- The College's degree and certificate offerings are also broken up into four main divisions the Humanities Division, the Business, Arts and Social Sciences Division, the Mathematics, Science and Technology Division, and the Health Professions Division.

The Business, Arts and Social Sciences Division is the largest division at Bergen in terms of enrollment with over 5,500 students enrolled in Fall 2020 – close to half of the student body.

- The most popular degree at Bergen for the last five Fall semesters was the A.S. in General Professional Studies. With 2,378 enrolled students, the AS.PS.GEN degree enrolled 20% of the entire Bergen student body in Fall 2020.
- The A.A. in General Liberal Arts has seen its enrollment increased by 18.4% in Fall 2020. It enrolled 702 students in Fall 2019 and 831 students in 2020 and increase of 129 students that semester. This increase in enrollment moved AA.LA.GEN from the fourth most enrolled program in Fall 2019 to the third most enrolled program in Fall 2020.




Degrees & Certificates Awarded





- Bergen Community College awarded over 11,000 degrees and certificates between 2016 and 2020 with an average of 2,257 degrees and certificates awarded a year.
- The number of degrees and certificates awarded has decreased over the last five years. In 2016, 2,410 awards were conferred. In 2020, that number fell 11.6% to 2,130 awards. Bergen has conferred about 100 fewer awards every year.



- Almost 80% of degrees and certificates awarded over the past five years have been from Transfer Programs (A.A. degrees, A.F.A. degrees, and A.S. degrees). Sixty-eight percent of the degrees and certificates awarded in the last five years have been Associate of Science degrees alone.
- The Business, Arts and Social Sciences Division has awarded the most degrees and certificates over the last five years. The division awarded 7,494 degrees and certificates between 2016 and 2020 – 66.6% of all the degrees and certificates awarded by the College.

• The General Liberal Arts program produced the most awards of any Humanities Division program from 2016 to 2020. In the last five years there has been a noteworthy decline in the number of AA.LA.GEN degree awarded. AA.LA.GEN awarded 131 degrees in 2016 and 34 degrees in 2020 – a decline of 74% in the last five years. The General Professional Studies program produced the most awards of any Business, Arts and Social Sciences program from 2016 to 2020. AS.PS.GEN awarded 4,018 degrees in the last five years (35.6% of all degrees and certificates awarded). The General Natural Sciences and Math program produced the most awards of any Mathematics, Science and Technology program from 2016 to 2020. AS.NSM.GEN awarded 425 degrees in the last five years. The Nursing program produced the most awards of any Health Professions program from 2016 to 2020. AAS.NURS.DAY and AAS.NURS.EVE awarded 446 degrees in the last five years.







Non-credit Enrollment





- Non-Credit courses are offered in three areas: Continuing Education, the Ciarco Learning Center, and the Institute for Learning in Retirement. The two main categories of non-credit courses are Open Enrollment and Customized Training. Customized Training is only available through the Continuing Education program.
- The total unduplicated headcount for Open Enrollment courses in all non-credit areas for Fiscal Year 2020 (FY2020) was 5,281 students. This is a decline from FY2019's unduplicated headcount of 5,595 students. This is a 5.6% decrease.
- Total duplicated enrollment in the Continuing Education Customized Training area decreased from 1,576 enrollments in FY2019 to 793 enrollments in FY2020. This is a 49.7% decrease.
- Unduplicated headcount in the Ciarco Learning Center Open Enrollment area decreased from 2,823 students in FY2019 to 2,405 students in FY2020, a 14.8% decrease.





College Outcomes





The College Outcomes Section includes a collection of reports that Institutional Research produces on an annual basis. This section focuses on student cohorts who started at Bergen at some point in the past and track these cohorts to various points depending on the outcome measure. Retention, graduation, and transfer rates are the three measures included in these reports.


- First-Time, Full-Time, Degree-Seeking students from Fall 2019 had a one-semester retention rate of 80.3% (retained to Spring 2020) and a one-year retention rate of 63.05% (retained to Fall 2020). Of the cohorts studied, the highest one-semester retention rate was for the Fall 2013 cohort students, 83.4% of whom were retained to Spring 2014. The highest one-year retention rate was for the Fall 2013 cohort students, 68.7% of whom were retained to Fall 2014.
- First-Time, Part-Time, Degree-Seeking students from Fall 2019 had a one-semester retention rate of 67.3.0% (retained to Spring 2020) and a one-year retention rate of 44.6% (retained to Fall 2020). The Fall 2019 cohort students also had the highest one-semester retention rate as 67.3% were retained to Fall 2020. Of the cohorts studied, the highest one-year retention rate was for the Fall 2017 cohort students, 53.1% of whom were retained to Fall 2018.
- Twenty-two percent of First-Time, Full-Time, Degree-Seeking students who started at Bergen in the Fall 2017 graduated within three years (before Fall 2020). Of the five cohorts included in the graduation rates analysis, the 2016 cohort had the highest graduation rate of 23%.
- The three-year graduation rate for females from the Fall 2017 First-Time, Full-Time, Degree-Seeking cohort is 25%, which is higher than the overall graduation rate (22%) and the graduation rate for males (20%).
- Fourteen percent of First-Time, Full-Time, Degree-Seeking students from the Fall 2017 cohort transferred without graduating from Bergen within three years. This rate represents a percentage point drop from 17% transfer rate for the 2016 Cohort. For the purpose of this analysis, it should be noted that the students counted in these rates may have transferred to four-year or two-year institutions.

SECOND – SIXTH SEMESTER RETENTION RATES FOR FALL 2016 – FALL 2020 FTFTDS COHORTS






SECOND – SIXTH SEMESTER RETENTION RATES FOR FALL 2016 – FALL 2020 FTPTDS COHORTS




2-YEAR GRADUATION RATE









3-YEAR TRANSFER (W/O GRADUATING) RATE




3-YEAR GRADUATION RATE BY GENDER


3-YEAR GRADUATION RATE BY RACE/ETHNICITY


3-YEAR GRADUATION RATE BY FINANCIAL AID


3-YEAR TRANSFER (W/O GRADUATING) RATE BY GENDER


3-YEAR TRANSFER (W/O GRADUATING) RATE BY RACE/ETHNICITY



- One hundred and ninety-one full-time faculty members identified as White (81.3%) in Fall 2020. Eleven identified as Hispanic/Latino (4.7%). These percentages are not reflective of the student body at Bergen as 35.0% of all students identify as White and 33.9% identify as Hispanic.
- Four hundred and one adjunct faculty members identified as White (71.1%). Fifty-eight identified as Hispanic (10.3%) and 31 identified as Black/African American (5.5%).
- Bergen Community College employed 390 non-instructional full-time staff in Fall 2020. This is down from the 398 non-instructional full-time staff the College employed in Fall 2019. The plurality of full-time staff members worked in the Service area at the College (91) followed by Office and Administrative Support (74) and Management (57) areas.
- Two hundred and sixteen full-time non-instructional staff members identified as White (55.4%).
 Seventy-three identified as Hispanic (18.7%) and sixty identified as Black or African American (15.4%).



- Total budgeted revenue decreased by 4.2% from Fiscal Year (FY) 2020 (July 1st, 2019 June 30th, 2020) to Fiscal Year (FY) 2021(July 1st, 2020 June 30th, 2021).
- Budgeted funding from tuition and fees fell from \$70,114,189 in FY2020 to \$65,402,634 in FY2021 while funding from Bergen County rose slightly from \$21,748,766 to \$22,033,742.

- Total budgeted unrestricted expenditures decreased by 6.1% from FY2020 to FY2021 (from \$106,427,218 to \$99,946,712).
- For FY2021, 77.0% of the total budgeted unrestricted expenditures were allocated to the areas of instruction (36.5%) and institutional support (40.5%). The remaining 23.0% was allocated to the areas of academic support (6.0%), student services (6.8%), plant operations (8.4%) and other miscellaneous expenditures (1.7%).
- Compared to the prior year, expenditures on instruction decreased by \$2,312,271 from FY2020 to FY2021. Similarly, expenditures on institutional support also decreased by \$2,835,774.




