General College Information



ABOUT BERGEN COMMUNITY COLLEGE



Bergen Community College was founded in 1965 to address the region's need for a convenient, affordable, and comprehensive higher education destination. The College currently enrolls over 13,500 students in credit courses. The College's three instructional sites in Paramus (Main Campus), Hackensack (Ciarco Learning Center), and Lyndhurst (Bergen Community College at the Meadowlands) offer exceptional opportunities for students enrolled in degree, continuing education, and adult education programs.

The College boasts an accomplished faculty, cutting-edge facilities, and opportunities for cultural awareness, civic engagement, and service-learning. Bergen has the distinction of being New Jersey's No. 1 ranked institution for associate degree graduates, a title the College has held dating back to 2014.

Graduating students not only utilize the statewide transfer agreement to attend New Jersey's four-year institutions, but use Bergen's reputation as a top community college to propel them to institutions nationwide. Students in career programs enter the workforce well prepared with the skills they need in order to succeed.

Within the last decade, Bergen has seen considerable growth in both size and facilities. The biggest physical addition to the College has been the completion of the Health Professions Integrated Teaching Center in Paramus, NJ featuring state-of-the-art dental hygiene equipment, a simulated operating room, and radiography and ultrasound labs. The 62,000 square foot center is the first of its kind in the region. Additionally, Bergen renovated the quad on the main campus to provide an aesthetically pleasing outdoor environment with passive green space, walking paths, seating, and outdoor instructional areas for students.

The complete renovation of the Student Affairs One-Stop Center creates an all-inclusive environment to enhance communications with students by removing administrative barriers and streamlining the process for admission, registration, financial aid and other supportive services. Bergen opened its Innovation Center at its Meadowlands location in November 2023. The Center includes new cybersecurity, gaming, and Bloomberg Finance laboratories, which are intended to prepare students for careers in areas with growth and opportunity. In addition, an Innovation Study Lounge and open access computer lab provide students with space to collaborate, share perspectives, and work on assignments.

In 2016, Bergen Community College went through its ten-year self-study review by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education (MSCHE) and reaffirmed its accreditation. In the Fall of 2022, Bergen Community College initiated the Self-Study process in preparation for its reaffirmation visit.

In 2018, Bergen was one of 13 New Jersey community colleges to be awarded part of a \$20 million grant from the State of New Jersey to offer a tuition-free college education to qualifying students. During Academic Year 2020-2021, Bergen awarded 1,106 CCOG recipients \$2,233,263 in total aid.

In March 2020, a statewide quarantine was mandated by order of New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy. Bergen swiftly responded and moved its operations online. It also served as a COVID testing center for the community. Bergen Community College returned to an open campus environment in the summer of 2021. Bergen also disbursed \$19,812,212 in Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students in 2021.



Navigating a Post COVID-19 era, the College is embarking on exciting and innovative initiatives that include new partners and enrollment opportunities. With the prestigious Aspen-AASCU Transfer Student Success and Equity Intensive, the Bergen Community College-William Paterson University partnership will provide practical support aimed at accelerating the reform of practices and policies associated with improved and equitable student transfer outcomes. Based on recommendations from the Bergen community, the College continues to invest significantly in virtual and distance education with the development of Bergen's Center for Online Learning, which will serve as a catalyst for the College's next generation of program and course offerings.

In May 2024, the College's Board of Trustees approved its new Strategic Plan, Focusing on the Future, with the focus on four themes: 1) Student Achievement and Enrollment, 2) Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Belongingness (DEIB), 3) Marketing, Communication, and Outreach, and 4) Innovation. Bergen has deepened its relationships with local and national partners including, New Bridge Medical Center, New Jersey Transit, Ramapo College of New Jersey, Montclair State University, and the Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities (HACU).

Student Demographics





Building on momentum from the prior fall term, Fall 2023 tenth-day student enrollment reflects a
notable 5.4% increase from Fall 2022. This contrasts with the challenges presented in Fall 2020,
where enrollment decreased by 12% due to the impact of COVID-19. Although the College still felt its
effects in Fall 2021 with a 5.3% decline in enrollment, Fall 2022 marked a turnaround – with a 3.6%
increase compared to the prior year.

- Students from 110 different countries of citizenship attended Bergen in Fall 2023, with the largest groups of non-U.S. students hailing from the Dominican Republic, Republic of Korea, Colombia, Ecuador, Turkey, and Albania.
- Seventy-seven percent of Fall 2023 students resided in Bergen County. The top five Bergen County municipalities where students lived were Hackensack, Garfield, Fair Lawn, Teaneck, and Lodi.
 Paramus, home to the College's main campus, was 11th on the list with 239 students. Lyndhurst, home of BCC at the Meadowlands, was 12th on the list with 238 students.


- Fifty-three percent of Fall 2023 students were 18- to 21-year-olds. Among the total student population, the average age of a Bergen student is 23.4 years old. This statistic supports the fact that although it is often assumed that community college students are non-traditional aged (i.e., delayed enrollment into postsecondary education), the majority of Bergen students are traditional aged college students (i.e., attending directly out of high school).
- Over the past five fall semesters, BCC's Hispanic student population has grown by 9.6 percentage points from 31.9% in Fall 2019 to 41.5% in Fall 2023. Bergen Community College is proud of its designation as a Hispanic-Serving Institution (HSI). This designation by U.S. Department of Education shapes both the culture and educational experiences for everyone at Bergen.






Enrollment by Age and Gender, Fall 2023


Unduplicated Enrollment by Gender and Status, Fall 2023

Student Enrollment Trends





Full-Time students (52%) outnumbered Part-Time students (48%) in Fall 2023. This continues a trend
established in Fall 2004. At the time, the margin of separation between the two types of students was
relatively small at 51% attending Full-Time and 49% attending Part-Time. In Fall 2019, the difference
was 53% Full-Time to 47% Part-Time. However, the difference in enrollment by attendance has been
getting closer in recent years as indicated in the table below.

- Overall enrollment in Fall 2023 rose by 5.4% from the previous fall term. Enrollment in Transfer Programs in Fall 2023 increased 5.9% from 8,241 to 8,724 year-over-year. Similarly, enrollment in Career Programs increased by 5.8% from 1,770 to 1,873 students.
- Bergen uses four classifications to identify student registration status. Instead of the traditional
 freshman, sophomore, junior, senior system, Bergen uses First-Time students (brand new to higher
 education), Transfer students (brand new to Bergen, but not higher education), Stop-Out/Re-admit
 students (attended Bergen in the past, but did not attend Bergen the previous semester), and
 Continuing students (returning students from the previous semester to the current semester).

The four Registration Statuses are used to track Bergen students and can help the College understand enrollment trends. Bergen's First-Time student population has grown both in headcount and proportion over the past five fall terms – increasing from 3,092 students (23.8% of the fall student body) in Fall 2019 to 3,480 (29.5%) of the fall student body in Fall 2023. This increase in First-Time students – despite overall declining numbers of high school graduates nationally in recent years¹ and the impact of COVID-19 – is a positive trend at Bergen. Retention of Continuing students remains a high priority at Bergen. The ripple effects of the pandemic have impacted student retention nationally and at Bergen as well. When examining credits generated by registration status, the College has seen a two-year decline in the percentage of Continuing students persisting year-to-year. To mitigate the impact of the pandemic on retention and provide the needed support for students, the College has developed actionable plans to identify students in need while expanding opportunities and supportive measures to improve student retention rates. This focus on retention is included in the new strategic plan, with a stated goal to increase the rates by 1% for the next five years.

• The most highly enrolled courses in Fall 2023 were in the Mathematics (MAT) discipline (4,294 enrollments and 14,229 credits generated overall). The most highly enrolled single course in Fall 2023 was WRT-101 (2,440 enrollments and 7,320 credits generated).



Unduplicated Enrollment by Attendance Status, Fall 2019 - Fall 2023







Percentage Enrolled by Program Type, Fall 2019 - Fall 2023





Enrollment by Program Type, Fall 2019 - Fall 2023



Percentage of Credits Generated by Program Type, Fall 2019 - Fall 2023





Distance Education





 The COVID-19 pandemic drastically changed the delivery method of Bergen Community College courses. The Fall 2020 semester saw a dramatic increase in online enrollment due to the COVID-19 pandemic which introduced a primarily working and learning environment.



- The number of exclusively online students has tapered since the Fall 2020 peak of 9,927 students. However, within the past five fall semesters, the proportion of exclusively online students has risen 10.8 percentage points from 5.4% in Fall 2019 to 16.2% in Fall 2023. In Fall 2023, over one-third of Bergen students (35.2%) were enrolled in at least one but not all distance education courses.
- Recognizing current student demand for online learning options and to meet anticipated demands of potential/future students, Bergen has taken proactive steps to bolster and broaden its distance education offerings. In Fall 2020, Bergen Community College codified the distinction between asynchronous, synchronous, and mix online classes. In online asynchronous courses there are no regular meeting times; in online synchronous courses there are required virtual meeting days and times; and in online mix courses there are a mix of asynchronous and synchronous class elements. In Spring 2023, the Center for Online Learning was launched. The Center for Online Learning is designed as a fully virtual campus where students can earn an associate's degree completely online as well as access all student support services. In Fall 2023, as of 10th Day, there were 74 students enrolled in the programs offered by the College of Online Learning.
- The most popular online course disciplines in Fall 2023 were psychology, writing, and information technology. Psychology offered 49 courses online in Fall 2023, enrolling 1,179 students (duplicated) and accounting for 3,537 credits.
- The most popular hybrid course disciplines in Fall 2023 were writing, English basic skills, and mathematics. Writing offered 47 hybrid courses, enrolling 977 students (duplicated) and accounting for 2,931 credits.



Remedial Education






- From Fall 2019 to Fall 2020, there was a decline of 25.8% in the number of students enrolled in at least one remedial course (EBS, ALP, or remedial MAT). However, since Fall 2020, there has been an upward trend in remedial course enrollment. From Fall 2020 to Fall 2023, the number of students enrolled in at least one remedial course increased 57% (2,386 students in 2020 and 3,744 in 2023). The proportion of students enrolled in at least one remedial course in Fall 2023 was 31.7% of the student population, as compared to 20.9% in Fall 2020.
- Over the last five fall semesters, enrollment in remedial courses has comprised between 13.2% to 15.9% of total credits generated each term. Remedial enrollment has consistently been highest in MAT courses relative to EBS and ALP courses. This enrollment trend continued in Fall 2023; 2,312 students were enrolled in at least one remedial MAT course, compared to 1,764 in at least one remedial EBS course and 591 in at least one ALP course.
- A breakdown of the varying remedial enrollment patterns among Bergen's student population can be seen by looking closer at unduplicated enrollment within remedial course offerings. There are five groupings of remedial course-takers: EBS only, ALP only, MAT only, MAT and EBS, and MAT and ALP. Among these groups of remedial course-takers in Fall 2023, the largest group 11.8% of the fall student body took only remedial MAT courses (1,389 students) without taking EBS or ALP courses. Students who were enrolled in both MAT and EBS (923 students) made up the second largest group at 7.8% of the Fall 2023 student population.
- The single most enrolled remedial course in Fall 2023 was MAT-011 (Basic Mathematics) with 1,042 course enrollments, followed by EBS-033 (Directed Studies in Writing II) with 896 course enrollments. The most enrolled ALP courses were those for Level 2 ALP students (ALP-051 through ALP-054), which brought in a total of 590 enrollments. Courses for Level 3 ALP students (ALP-061 through ALP-064) brought in 402 enrollments in Fall 2023.

Unduplicated Enrollment by Course Type, Fall 2019 - Fall 2023






Unduplicated Enrollment Within Remedial Courses, Fall 2023

Program Enrollment





- Bergen Community College's degrees and certificates are broken down into two categories Transfer Programs and Career Programs. Transfer Programs are designed to give students an education that is easily transferrable to a four-year college and include the Associate of Arts (A.A.) degrees, Associate of Science (A.S.) degrees, and the Associate of Fine Arts (A.F.A.) degrees. Career Programs are designed to give students the skills to immediately join the workforce and are divided into Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) degrees, Certificates (CERT.), and Certificates of Achievement (C.O.A.).
- In Fall 2023, Associate of Science degrees continue to be the most popular offerings at Bergen Community College. Almost two-thirds of the entire student body – 7,618 students – were enrolled in A.S. degrees.
- The College's degree and certificate offerings are broken up into four main divisions the Humanities Division; the Business and Social Sciences Division; the Mathematics, Science and Technology Division; and the Health Professions Division.
- The Business and Social Sciences Division is the largest division at Bergen in terms of enrollment with 5,044 students enrolled in Fall 2023.

- The most popular program at Bergen for the last five fall semesters has been the A.S. in General Professional Studies (AS.PS.GEN). With 2,012 enrolled students, the AS.PS.GEN degree enrolled 17% of the entire Bergen student body in Fall 2023.
- The A.S. in Professional Studies, Exploratory Program (AA.PS.EXPL) has seen its enrollment continue to increase. In Fall 2020, AA.PS.EXPL enrolled 388 students. In Fall 2023, AA.PS.EXPL enrolled 1,321 students. This increase in enrollment places AA.PS.EXPL as the third most enrolled program in Fall 2023.




Percentage Enrolled by Degree Type, Fall 2019 - 2023


Degrees and Certificates Awarded







The Degrees and Certificates Awarded section of the Fact Book presents the number of credentials awarded by the College – showing these tallies by academic division, award type, etc. The focus is the number of attempted academic programs completed each fiscal year. In contrast, the following section, Graduated Students, examines Bergen Community College graduates by demographic information over the past five years. Here, the focus is not the credential earned but rather the individual who earned it.

At Bergen, there are three points within the fiscal year when the institution issues degrees and certificates to students –the end of the Summer, Fall, and Spring semesters. Within a fiscal year, one graduate may be awarded more than one credential. For example, within the fiscal year of 2023-24, a student may earn and be awarded a Certificate in December 2023 and an Associates of Science degree in May 2024. Therefore, it should be noted that the fiscal year totals in the Degrees and Certificates Awarded section and in the Graduated Students section may differ slightly.


- The percentage of graduates who identify as Hispanic has increased over the past five fiscal years by 7.9 percentage points from 25.7% in FY 2019 to 33.6% in FY 2023.
- Similarly, but not to the same magnitude, the percentage of graduates who identify as Black or African American and the percentage of graduates who identify as Asian has increased over the past five fiscal years. The percentage of Asian graduates rose from 7.7% in FY 2019 to 11.2% in FY 2023. The percentage of Black or African American graduates rose from 4.3% in FY 2019 to 6.2% in FY 2023.
- In FY 2023, 56.6% of Bergen graduates were female and 43.4% were male.
- For FY 2023, 50.6% of Bergen graduates were between the ages of 18-24 years old (839 of 1,658 graduates). Forty-one percent were between the ages of 25-39 years old (687 of 1,658 graduates). The average age of a graduate in Fiscal Year 2023 was 27 years old.








The following College Outcomes section is comprised of a collection of reports that Institutional Research produces on an annual basis. As opposed to looking at a current student body like other sections, the College Outcomes section focuses on certain student cohorts that started at Bergen at some point in the past. These cohorts are then tracked for outcomes such as retention, graduation, and transferring.


- First-Time, Full-Time, Degree-Seeking students from Fall 2022 had a one-semester retention rate of 78.1% (retained to Spring 2023) and a one-year retention rate of 64.3% (retained to Fall 2023). Of the cohorts studied, the highest one-semester retention rate was for the Fall 2017 cohort students, 81.8% of whom were retained to Spring 2018. The Fall 2017 cohort students also had the highest one-year retention rate as 65.5% were retained to Fall 2018.
- First-Time, Part-Time, Degree-Seeking students from Fall 2022 had a one-semester retention rate of 64.9% (retained to Spring 2023) and a one-year retention rate of 52.7% (retained to Fall 2023). Of the cohorts studied, the highest one-semester retention rate was for the Fall 2019 cohort students, 67.3% of whom were retained to Spring 2020. The highest one-year retention rate was for the Fall 2017 cohort students, 53.1% of whom were retained to Fall 2018.
- Twenty-four percent of First-Time, Full-Time, Degree-Seeking students from Fall 2020 graduated from Bergen within three years (before Fall 2023). This is the second highest graduation rate for any cohort studied (dating back to the Fall 2010 cohort).
- The three-year graduation rate for females from the Fall 2020 First-Time, Full-Time, Degree-Seeking cohort is 27%, which is higher than the overall graduation rate (24%) and the graduation rate for males (21%).
- Seventeen percent of First-Time, Full-Time, Degree-Seeking students from the Fall 2020 cohort transferred without graduating from Bergen within three years. Some of these students transferred to a four-year institution while others transferred to another two-year institution.


2-YEAR GRADUATION RATE












3-YEAR GRADUATION RATE BY GENDER


3-YEAR GRADUATION RATE BY RACE/ETHNICITY




3-YEAR TRANSFER (W/O GRADUATING) RATE BY GENDER


3-YEAR TRANSFER (W/O GRADUATING) RATE BY RACE/ETHNICITY





- Non-Credit courses are offered in three areas: Continuing Education, the Ciarco Learning Center, and the Institute for Learning in Retirement. The two main categories of non-credit courses are Open Enrollment and Customized Training. Customized Training is only available through the Continuing Education program.
- The total unduplicated headcount for Open Enrollment courses in all non-credit areas for Fiscal Year 2023 (FY2023) was 5,437 students. This is an increase from FY2022's unduplicated headcount of 4,350 students. This is a 19.7% increase.
- Total duplicated enrollment in the Continuing Education Customized Training area increased from 1,015 enrollments in FY2022 to 1,433 enrollments in FY2023. This is a 41.2% increase.
- Unduplicated headcount in the Ciarco Learning Center Open Enrollment area increased from 476 students in FY2022 to 839 students in FY2023, a 76.3% increase.

Finance





- Total budgeted revenue increased by 1.6% from Fiscal Year 2023 (July 1st, 2022 June 30th, 2023) to Fiscal Year 2024 (July 1st, 2023– June 30th, 2024).
- Budgeted funding from tuition and fees increased from FY2023 to FY2024 by 7.6% or \$4,792,433.
 FY2024 budgeted funding from both the State of New Jersey and Bergen County rose 1.2% and 4.2% respectively (an increase of \$160,846 from the State and \$946,996 from Bergen County compared to the prior year).

- Total budgeted unrestricted expenditures increased by 2.3% from FY2023 to FY2024 (from \$104,137,000 to \$106,570,232).
- For FY2024, 77.4% of the total budgeted unrestricted expenditures were allocated to the areas of instruction (34.6%) and institutional support (42.8%). The remaining 23.6% was allocated to the areas of academic support (5.5%), student services (6.7%), plant operations (8.8%) and other miscellaneous expenditures (1.6%).
- Compared to the prior year, expenditures on instruction increased by \$259,767 from FY2023 to FY2024. Similarly, expenditures on institutional support increased by \$2,150,259.




