
# **NEW STUDENT SURVEY REPORT**

Fall 2022





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## **Highlights**

- The New Student Survey was administered to 2,775 students who were attending higher education for the first time at Bergen Community College in the Fall 2022 semester.
- The invitation to participate in the survey was sent to the students' Bergen and personal email addresses. Four hundred and eighteen students responded to this invitation for a response rate of 15%. (2018 was 18%)
- Respondents indicated that, in general, the following reasons were very important when deciding to attend college: "to get training for a specific career" (80%), "to be able to get a job/better job" (78%), and "to learn more about things that interest me" (78%).
- Respondents indicated that the following reasons were very important to them when deciding to attend Bergen specifically: "price of tuition" (78%), "overall reputation of Bergen" (55%), "academic reputation of my chosen major" (54%), and "to attend a school close to my home" (53%).
- The majority of respondents registered for classes more than one week before the start of the semester (80%) and attended an on-campus orientation (45%).
- When asked about applying for financial assistance, 36% said they applied three or more months before classes began and 23% said they did not apply for financial assistance. Forty-one percent of respondents indicated that family sources were the main source they were using to pay for Bergen.
- Since enrolling at Bergen, respondents indicated that Bergen staff members have been their main source of information in the following student support areas: choosing courses (34%), graduation requirements (32%), and other academic requirements and procedures (29%).
- The services that were most used by respondents since their enrollment at Bergen were the Library/Learning Resource Center (63%) and One Stop (60%). Fifty-four percent of students have not used but intend to use transfer advisement and 48% intend to use tutoring services.
- Regarding respondents' perceptions during their first few weeks at Bergen, 88% agreed or strongly agreed with the statement: "The very first time I came to this college I felt welcomed." Ninety-six agreed or strongly agreed with the statement: ""The instructors at this college want me to succeed."
- The majority of respondents (87%) planned to take classes again at Bergen in Spring 2023 and plan to complete their certificate or degree at Bergen within 1-2 years (57%). Thirty-one percent of respondents indicated the highest academic degree they intend to obtain is a Bachelor's, 24% intend to obtain an Associate degree and 19% intend to obtain a Master's.

#### Introduction

Colleges use entrance surveys to learn more about new students. Inspired by the work of other colleges, Institutional Research created its own New Student Survey. The purpose of the survey was to better understand the educational journey of our new students. Questions were framed around five themes: College Perceptions, College Preparation, Early College Experience, Future Plans, and High School Student Experience. In October 2022, an invitation to participate in the New Student Survey was emailed to both the Bergen and personal email addresses of 2,775 *first-time-to-higher-education* students. The survey was open from October 28, 2022 to December 31, 2022. The survey included twenty-three questions. There were 418 total unduplicated responses (15% response rate). Percentages presented in this report have been rounded to the nearest whole number. Appendix A lists the questions asked in the survey.

## **College Perceptions**

## Reasons for Attending College

When asked, "In deciding to attend college generally, how important were each of the following reasons to you?" 80% of respondents said a very important reason they decided to attend college was to get training for a specific career. Other reasons for attending college indicated as very important were to get a job/better job, to gain a general education and appreciation of ideas, and to learn more about things that interest them (with each reason noted by 78% of respondents). Eleven other reasons were specified and are listed in the respondents' exact words below.

## Reasons for Attending Bergen Community College

The students were asked the specific reasons they decided to attend Bergen Community College. Seventy-eight percent of respondents said a very important reason was the cost of tuition. Three other very important reasons indicated were "Overall reputation of Bergen" (55%), "Academic reputation of my chosen major" (54%), and "To attend a school close to my home" (53%). Eleven other reasons were specified and are listed in the respondents' exact words below.

### **College Preparations**

## **Registering for Courses**

When asked when they registered for courses for their first semester at Bergen, 80% of respondents indicated they had registered more than one week before classes began. Fifteen percent had registered during the week before classes began.

## Applying for Financial Assistance

When asked when they first applied for financial assistance, 36% of respondents indicated they had applied three or more months before classes began. Twenty-three percent of students applied one to two months before classes began. Another 23% had not applied for financial assistance.

#### Participating in Orientation

When asked about their participation in orientation, 45% of respondents indicated they attended an on-campus orientation and 30% were unable to participate due to scheduling or other issues. Twenty-six percent of respondents were not aware of a college orientation.

## **Sources for Paying Tuition**

The respondents were asked: "Which of the following sources are you using to pay for your first semester at Bergen?" Forty-one percent of respondents said family sources were their main source. Aid that will need to be repaid was not a source for 57% of respondents. Seven other reasons were specified and are listed in the respondents' exact words below.

## **Early College Experience**

## Experiences During the First Few Weeks at Bergen

The respondents were asked: "During the first few weeks of your college career, about how often have you done the following?" Fifty-eight percent of respondents said they often/very often participated in class discussions and 57% often/very often became excited by a class. Eighty-eight percent of respondents indicated they never/rarely skipped class and 77% indicated they never/rarely missed submitting an assignment.

#### Sources of Information

When asked about their main source of information for student support areas, respondents indicated Bergen staff members were their source for choosing courses (34%), graduation requirements (32%), and other academic requirements and procedures (29%). Twenty percent of students said that friends, family, or other students were their main source of information for choosing a program of study, while 21% did not seek this information. Twenty-eight percent of respondents indicated that friends, family, or other students were their main source of information for financial aid. When asked about academic goal-setting, 20% percent indicated instructors were their main source of information, another 20% percent noted Bergen staff members, and 24% of respondents did not look for this information.

### **Usage of Services**

The respondents were asked about their usage of services at Bergen since the time of their enrollment. The Library/Learning Resource Center was the service that was most used by respondents (63%) followed by One-Stop (60%), and academic advising (53%). Fifty-four percent of students have not used but intend to use transfer advisement and 48% intend to use tutoring services. Forty-five percent of respondents were not aware of Student Conduct and 38% percent of respondents were not aware of the Financial Literacy Center.

## Perceptions During the First Few Weeks at Bergen

Respondents were asked about their perceptions during their first few weeks at Bergen. Fifty-eight percent of respondents strongly agreed with the statement "At least one instructor learned my name" and 47% strongly agreed they "have the motivation to do what it takes to succeed in college." Fifty-seven percent of respondents agreed that the very first time they came to Bergen they felt welcomed. Thirty percent of respondents disagreed/strongly disagreed with the statement "The college provided me with adequate information about financial assistance."

## **Experiences During High School**

The respondents were asked: "During your high school career, about how often did you do the following?" Sixty-one percent of respondents said they often/very often participated in class discussions and 58% said they often/very often received prompt written or oral feedback from an instructor on their performance. Eighty percent of respondents indicated they never/rarely skipped class and 64% of respondents indicated they never/rarely missed turning in an assignment.
