Justification

EBSCO Industries, Inc. is the preferred subscription service for periodicals for academic libraries. Small vendors are still in the marketplace but they deal with limited titles on limited subjects and service primarily K-12. EBSCO provides us with a robust system which allows online ordering, billing, renewals, reports, training, claiming, and individual customer service for over 500 periodical titles in our current print collection. EBSCO has been our subscription service for scholarly journals and magazines since the mid 1990's. EBSCO is also the provider of online subscription services, including *Philosopher's Index* –a database that contains over 680 journals. EBSCO provides value added electronic services which are compatible with the college's integrated library management system.

There exists a need for the College to procure periodicals for the library pursuant to a non-fair and open process in accordance with the provisions of <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 19:44A-20.4. EBSCO Information Services has completed and submitted a Political Contribution Disclosure Form in accordance with <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 19:44A-20.26, a Stockholder Disclosure Certification, and a Business Entity Disclosure Certification, certifying that it has not made any reportable contributions to a political or candidate committee in the County of Bergen in the prior year, and that the contract will prohibit it from making any reportable contributions through the term of the contract. The Political Contribution Disclosure Form, Stockholder Disclosure Certification, and Business Entity Disclosure Certificate shall be placed and maintained on file at the College.

Justification

VALE is the cooperative purchasing consortium for NJ academic Libraries which allows substantial discounts for annual subscriptions to full-text electronic databases which are available 24/7 to offcampus and on-campus users. The organization currently has fifty-two active member institutions. We subscribe to ten (10) databases offered through the consortium's discount program. See attachment for list of databases.

NJEDge.net is a non-profit organization and is exempt from Pay-to-Play.

Consortium purchases are allowed in accordance with County College Contracts Law 18A:64A-25.10.

The Career Development Institute (CDI) is contracted to provide instruction and certification preparation for animal control officer (CD 072) and animal cruelty investigator (CD 071) training. This organization is the only vendor known to the NJ Department of Health and Senior Services (NJDOHSS), and the NJ Police Training Commission to provide this training in the State of NJ. The NJ DOHSS approves all training programs and candidates for the animal control officer and animal cruelty investigator certifications. A state representative indicated that approximately two thirds of this programming across the state is provided by CDI. The remainder of approved programming is provided by other colleges themselves. Bergen Community College is the only training site in the Bergen County region, and will be the only training site in the state for the Wildlife Rehabilitators and Pet First Aid/CPR/Emergency Preparedness programs.

Bergen Community College proposes an oral history and storytelling project in which adults share essays, journal entries, letters, and artifacts they have saved from their experiences learning a foreign language. In Translation: Oral Histories and Stories from Language Learners focuses on the English as a Second Language (ESL) adult student community at Bergen Community College Hackensack, but is open to anyone who has lived, worked, or studied abroad, whether they have struggled with or triumphed over a new language. In Translation will celebrate the wonderfully unique things that people create in their second language, in order to reveal stories about their lives. During the Phase I incubation period, a partnership will form with the Bergen County Historical Society and among three divisions at the College: the Ciarco Learning Center (CLC), the Center for Peace, Justice and Reconciliation (CPJR), and the Humanities Department. Faculty and students in American Ethnic Literature (a Humanities class) will mentor adult English language learners from the CLC to develop communication skills and prepare for the first of a series of live public storytelling events hosted by CPJR at the CLC in fall 2016. Phase II will expand the initiative; Audiences at the CLC will have an opportunity to view curated exhibits of significant objects and photographs that figured prominently in students' language learning experience. The community at large will have a range of opportunities to hear participant stories, view video presentations, and access a wide range of resources documenting learner experiences.

No college funds are required; although a 100% in-kind college match is needed. This is comprised of administrative and facility costs, project oversight, production support, and staff time as included in the budget.

Abstract In Translation: Oral Histories and Stories from Language

Overview

Bergen Community College (BCC) proposes an oral history and storytelling project in which adults share essays, journal entries, letters, and artifacts they have saved from their experiences learning a foreign language. In Translation: Oral Histories and Stories from Language Learners focuses on the English as a Second Language (ESL) adult student community at Bergen Community College Hackensack, but is open to anyone who has lived, worked, or studied abroad, whether they have struggled with or triumphed over a new language. In Translation will celebrate the wonderfully unique things that people create in their second language, in order to reveal stories about their lives. During the incubation period, a partnership will form among three divisions at the College: the Ciarco Learning Center (CLC), the Center for Peace, Justice and Reconciliation (CPJR), and the Humanities Department. Faculty and students in American Ethnic Literature (a Humanities class) will mentor adult English language learners from the CLC to develop communication skills and prepare for the first of a series of live public storytelling events hosted by CPJR at the CLC in fall 2016. Audiences at the CLC will have an opportunity to view a curated exhibit of significant objects and photographs that figured prominently in students' language learning experience. Stories will be printed in a program booklet distributed to all attendees, captured on video and edited for broadcast on BCC's TV station. Finally, In Translation's project team will evaluate results and plan deeper oral history documentation leading to a Phase II series of storytelling events and exhibits in 2017.

In Translation aims both to encourage further understanding of language as a key component of cultural identity and to celebrate English language learners' interpretations of their own experiences. In Translation is needed to build knowledge about the experience of learning a language, from the perspective of diverse people. We are committed to generating knowledge from different cultural perspectives, on topics that would be meaningful to English language learners. Two key staff will implement the initiative. Ellen Feig has been conducting ethnic identity research around Canadian refugees for many years and became interested in how people perceive themselves in connection to their language. Marion Jacobson is a cultural studies scholar who is charged with marketing the CLC to the growing population of Bergen County residents desiring to improve their English and transfer to college and employment. **In Translation** is a natural offshoot of BCC's mission to make the CLC a vitally welcoming presence in the community.

A review of academic literature suggests this is an underexplored topic. Oral history is best suited to address proposed goals because language acquisition is a process, not an event. Oral history has been recognized by scholars as a way to increase accessibility to historical knowledge and increase motivation in pursuit of that knowledge (Olmedo, 1997). ESL instructors also recognize the value of oral histories as a method of not only making American history more relevant and inclusive to newcomers, but also increasing linguistic competence. Performance has real benefits for ESL learners as well as traditional college students who employ reading, speaking, listening, and writing skills as they hone their stories.

Justification

This project, *No Man's Land: Dialogues on the Experience of War*, intends to explore the intersection of World War I and the ongoing war in Iraq and, now, Syria. The focus on these wars will enable our program to address interests of our community, including a significant population of veterans from the Iraq war, a growing population of displaced Syrians, some of whom are now enrolled in Bergen Community College, and an Armenian diaspora concerned with raising awareness of genocide (ironically, many Armenian Syrians today have been displaced from the very spaces in Syria to which they were banished during World War I).

Most of the participants in our discussion groups will be military veterans, but seats will be open to interested members of the public, including non-combatants affected by war, military families and Bergen Community College students. A preparatory program will be conducted in the fall of 2017 and the first discussion group will launch during the spring semester, 2018. Our goal is to enhance the program and launch more discussion groups in fall, 2018 and spring 2019, for a total of five discussions. We believe that this number will lay the foundation for a sustainable, long-term program that can be expanded beyond the terms of the grant. Guest lectures, film screenings, art and photography exhibits will augment discussions. Many programs are already taking place as part of the ongoing initiatives conducted by the Center for Peace, Justice and Reconciliation and the Veterans' Center at Bergen Community College.

No college funds are required. The abstract is attached. The budget will follow.

Abstract

No Man's Land: Dialogues on the Experience of War

The proposed dialogue project will explore the intersection of World War I and the ongoing war in Iraq and, now, Syria. This focus addresses interests of the college community, including students who are veterans of Iraq and Afghan wars, a growing population of displaced Syrians, and an Armenian diaspora concerned with raising awareness of genocide (ironically, many Armenian Syrians today have been displaced from the very spaces in Syria to which they were banished during World War I).

The dialogue is augmented with literature: short fiction, poetry, and novels; visual art: film, photography, painting, installation and performance art, along with memoirs of war, and non-fiction discussions of trauma. These genres provide a mechanism for exploring how trauma often resists traditional notions of representation; that is, coming to terms with trauma often requires a process of imagining that gives rise to unique forms of expression. For example, discussions may explore how the emergence of the modern notion of trauma in World War I is also a trauma that occurred in the realm of literature and visual art, as traditional forms of expression gave way to modernism.

As the title of the proposal suggests, discussions will revolve around the sense of displacement occasioned by the trauma of violent conflict, for both non-combatants in conflict zones and combat veterans. Discussions will explore the challenges veterans and non-veterans with experience of war face in the aftermath of such conflict.

Our focus on World War I and on the war in Iraq and Syria provides an opportunity to explore how earlier wars condition and determine contemporary conflict. We will explore how traditional notions of patriotism, heroism, and glory gave way to the modern concept of trauma during World War I, and what this means for today's veterans and non-combatants as they struggle to express their own experience of war. Each of the five discussions will revolve around a unique set of sources drawn from different media. For each dialogue, we will select sources that encourage participants to make connections that are thematic, structural, personal, and historical.

To ensure that participants will engage with the discussion materials, we propose to use brief, targeted readings, along with concise renderings of visual art and film, for each dialogue. To meet the interests of our community, source material will focus heavily on American cultural expressions of the experience of war. Here is an example of what the content of one discussion might look like:

A. Eligibility criteria.

- 1. Judged to have made outstanding contributions to the College
- 2. Have served a minimum of fifteen (15) years of service at the College
- 3. Have achieved the rank for full professor for a minimum of five (5) years or a combined 10 years at the rank of full professor and associate professor.
- 4. Awarded posthumously if deceased within the last three years and met 1, 2, and 3.

B. Method of Selection

- 1. Faculty members may be nominated by department or division or by petition of 10% of the tenured faculty members.
- 2. Individual faculty members may not be nominated by a division or by petition more than two times.
- 3. The Vice President of Academic Affairs with the approval of the President shall appoint a special screening committee to consider faculty nominations. This committee will recommend to the president those faculty deemed to be qualified for the designation of "Professor Emeritus."
- 4. The Vice President of Academic Affairs and the screening committee may make recommendations of individuals for the title of "Professor Emeritus." Exceptional individuals who do not meet all the criteria listed herein or have been nominated more than two times may also be considered by the Chief Academic Officer and the screening committee for recommendation to the president and subsequently to the Board of Trustees.
- 5. Recommendations, submitted to the personnel committee for the designation of Professor Emeritus shall be approved by the full Board of Trustees.

C. Benefits

Individuals awarded the title of Professor Emeritus may enjoy the following benefits:

- 1. Listing in the College catalog, including photo and year during which status was granted.
- 2. Inclusion on the mailing list for all academic occasions, including events sponsored by the BCC Foundation
- 3. Available meeting space, computer support and staff support, as needed, through the BCC Foundation with prior approval from the Executive Director
- 4. The opportunity to retain their bergen.edu email address
- 5. Invitation to participate in public ceremonies, such as graduation
- 6. Provision of a faculty identification card for free use of the library and physical education facilities.
- 7. Provision of a faculty parking decal
- 8. Conferral of a Professor Emeritus scroll from the Board of Trustees
- 9. The opportunity to teach one course per semester/session up to five contact hours at the established professor emeritus rate (\$850/credit as of the date of the approval this resolution)
- 10. The opportunity to mentor new faculty members under the direction of the Vice President of Academic Affairs and respective dean

The last times changes were made to the Professor Emeritus program was in 1987. The above changes better reflect the current status of Bergen's retiring faculty members, and the revised benefits add additional prestige to the program.

The Weekend College at the Meadowlands (WC@TM) is Bergen Community College's proposed program specifically designed for working students that enables them to earn a college degree in two years by completing classes only on weekends and via online learning. It is designed to appeal to a student population that the College has had difficulty reaching in the past. The short-term classes and cohort scheduling have been specifically designed to accommodate these students' schedules and facilitate their success. At the end of two years, the students will have earned an Associate's Degree in Professional Studies (AS.PS.GEN).

The details of the program, including its costs, are attached.

Weekend College at the Meadowlands

Weekend College at the Meadowlands (WC@TM) is Bergen Community College's program specifically designed for working students that enables them to earn a college degree in two years by completing classes only on weekends and via online learning.

WC@TM is for students who are self-motivated and able to handle the demands of an accelerated program with a combination of online, hybrid and face-to-face classes. By enrolling in WC@TM, students become part of a cohort that provides them with the support they need to succeed academically. Because the program only requires students to come to campus on Saturdays and Sundays, it allows them to balance their work and family responsibilities with their education. Each semester WC@TM students are able to enroll in five classes, one of which will be fully online. The other four classes are offered consecutively over three weekends (with a weekend off between classes) using a combination of face-face and hybrid formats. These classes run from 9:00am-3:30pm on Saturdays and Sundays at our beautiful Lyndhurst campus. WC@TM students also have a designated advisor at the Meadowlands to provide them with academic support, as well as tutoring support available online and in-person.






