


Holocaust Remembrance

**Simon Jeruchim will give a talk on his life as
"A Hidden Child in France during the Holocaust"**

Simon Jeruchim was born in Paris, France on December 25, 1929. In July 1942 the French police, collaborating with the Nazis, rounded up Jews in Paris to be sent to death camps. Simon's family escaped from the roundup but were still in a precarious situation as the police continued tracking Jews. By a stroke of luck, Simon's parents were put in touch with neighbors, a compassionate gentile couple, who was connected with an underground network organized to save Jewish children. Twelve-year old Simon and his two siblings, fourteen and five were sent in hiding in Normandy and placed separately with gentile families. Simon's parents, while attempting to escape to the unoccupied zone of France, were arrested crossing the border, deported and murdered in Auschwitz. Simon and his siblings survived the war.
