

Holocaust Survivor **Trudy Album** Shares Her Story....

Trudy Album was born in 1929 in Czechoslovakia. When the Nazis invaded, her family was sent first to a ghetto, then to several concentration camps. Trudy arrived in the women's section of Birkenau, a sub-camp of Auschwitz, shortly before her 15th birthday. Her mother and three younger siblings had already been sent to their deaths. She was later sent to several work camps and was eventually liberated by the American Army. She hitchhiked back to her hometown, hoping to be reunited with her father, only to find out that he had also been murdered.

Trudy lives in Suffern, NY and has been engaged with the Holocaust Museum & Center for Tolerance and Education for several decades. Though it is difficult to share her painful experiences, Trudy is committed to ensuring that the memory, lessons, and legacies of the Holocaust are carried on.
